Poet, Novelist, Traveler
Elizabeth Bishop (February 8, 1918 - March 3, 1960) was an American poet, novelist, and travel writer. She is considered one of the greatest poets of the 20th century. Her poetry is characterized by its precision, clarity, and emotional depth. She was married to the poet and translator John Bishop, and they traveled extensively together. Her work often explored themes of identity, place, and the human condition.

CREATIVE WRITING

Students in Mrs. Custer's Creative Writing Class were given the assignment of producing a short movie about a poet that included their own reading of a poem and a biography of the authors life work. BIOLOGY
