Timers

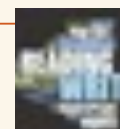

Online ideas for everyone

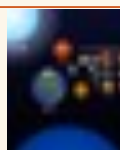

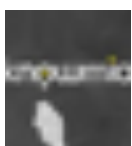

[Nearpod](#) slide show with quizzes. Students view you control. Really check it out. (free)+

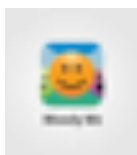


[Knowmia](#) record your own lessons to embed on the moodle for the students. Can search a shared [data base](#) of lessons all year levels.

[Skyview free](#). Check out where the stars are now. or the hubble telescope you'll be amazed. (free)

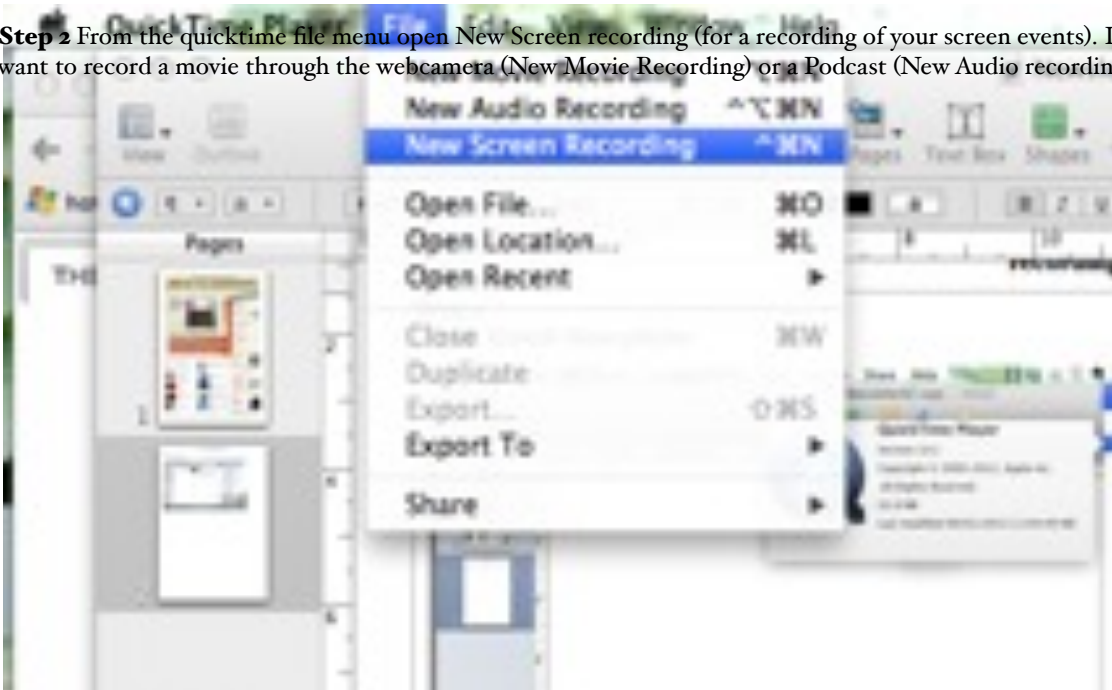


QUICKTIME Screen recording.

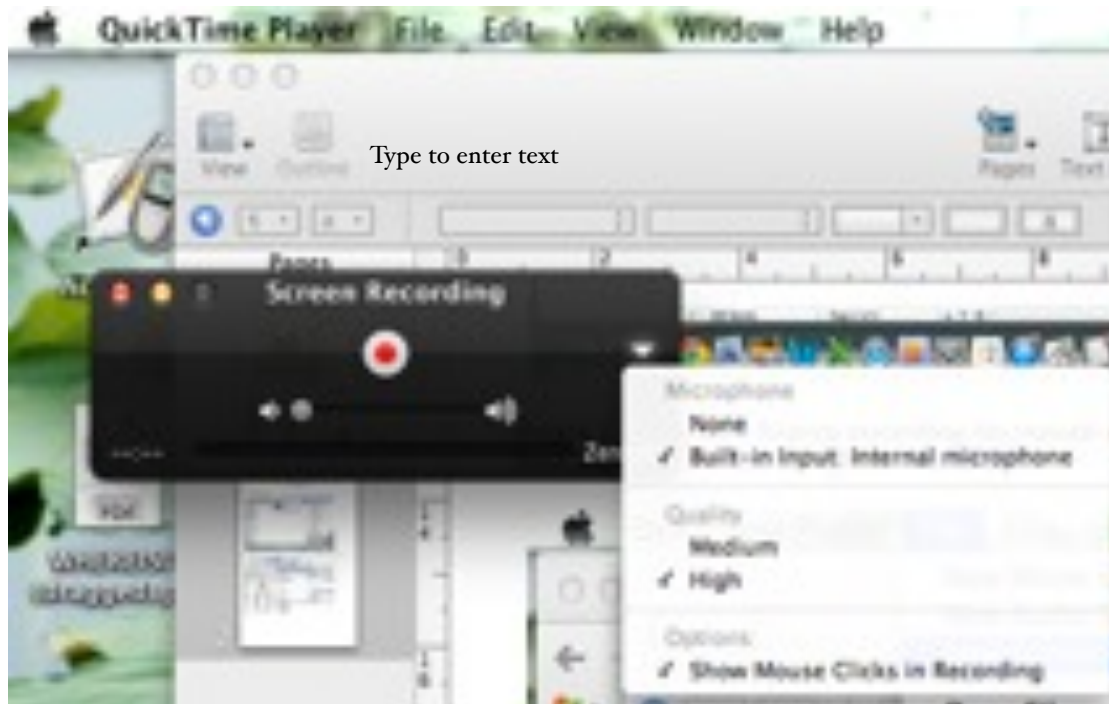
Step 1 Open the QuickTime Player



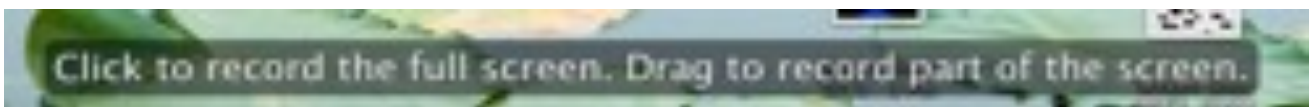
Step 2 From the quicktime file menu open New Screen recording (for a recording of your screen events). If you want to record a movie through the webcam (New Movie Recording) or a Podcast (New Audio recording)



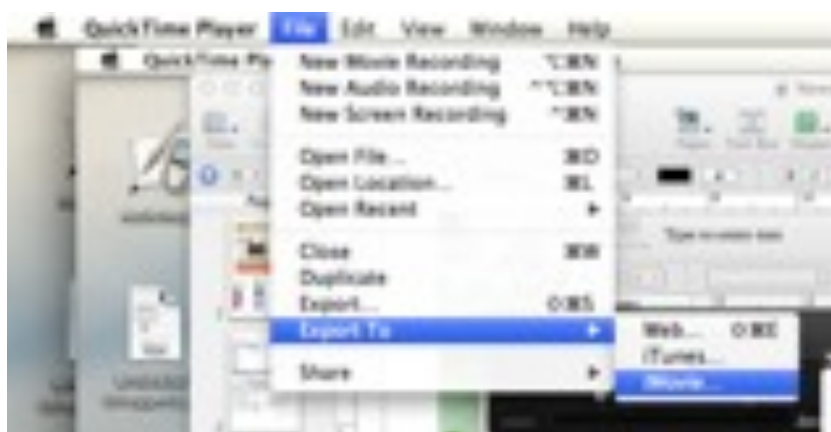
Step 3. Click drop down menu of screen recording (small inverted triangle) and check on or off the input mic, depending on if you want a voice over on the recording.



Step 4. Record by clicking red button. You have then an option of dragging to record a part of the screen or full screen.



Step 5. When finished click on the grey button (red before recording) and the file will open. When exiting were you would like it saved when exiting, or you can export to Web, iTunes, iMovie for editing.
