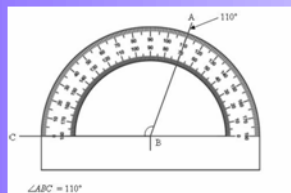

The Exciting Week

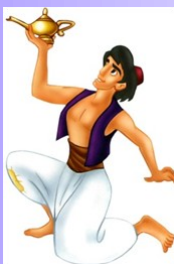
This week two secondary
