Developed plans with teachers to refine. *Bridget used BL COT for readers' workshop to help teachers prepare for principal observations.*Laurie reflected that because feedback was so positive from PD <i>Using Math Talk</i> (to help students learn) math coaches will offer PD again. *PD day – Feb. 22 <sup>nd</sup> – see C & I wiki for information -Middle School Agenda recently added -Core support – PE, media, etc. varies from school to school
<b>Leadership for Innovation</b>	Pam Kidder	Discussed AIG plan for GCS: *Strengths – identification of students, differentiation, on-line courses

		*Upgrades needed – staff development offerings; AIG add on licensure; collaboration with other teachers; partnerships with businesses and community
<b>Other</b>	Dr. Farley	Safety – culture change; all staff must sign in when visiting other schools; all staff must wear ID badges (including Dr. Farley);
		Professionalism – culture is changing in GCS with options for teaching and learning; guard what is said about changes and GCS when speaking as an employee of the school system; if an employee does not like the changes or direction, employee should consider other options
		Magnet school: *Common Instruction Framework (CIF) *Will not have principal – Chris Ham as director; will have lead teacher, curriculum coach *2 parts – 6 <sup>th</sup> grade...2 grade levels behind in reading; Accelerating students in 9 <sup>th</sup> grade who are in danger of dropping out due to boredom or other factors; students to be identified by data; selection by lottery; year round calendar; parents must agree to support; students make promise to graduate
<b>Healthy, Responsible Students</b>	Tina Clayton Audrey Kreisher & 8 <sup>th</sup> Grade students from NGMS	As a result of the Oct. 29 <sup>th</sup> PD day, middle school teacher Kreisher and her ELA peer planned a scenario to engage students – <i>Same Gender Schools vs. Traditional Schools</i> . After the teaching and learning took place, students debated the pros and cons of the idea. Students were asked how they liked learning this way. Students commented that it was “fun” and enjoyed having a choice in their learning. C & I members also asked the students questions.
