This **flower** can turn to face the **sun**.

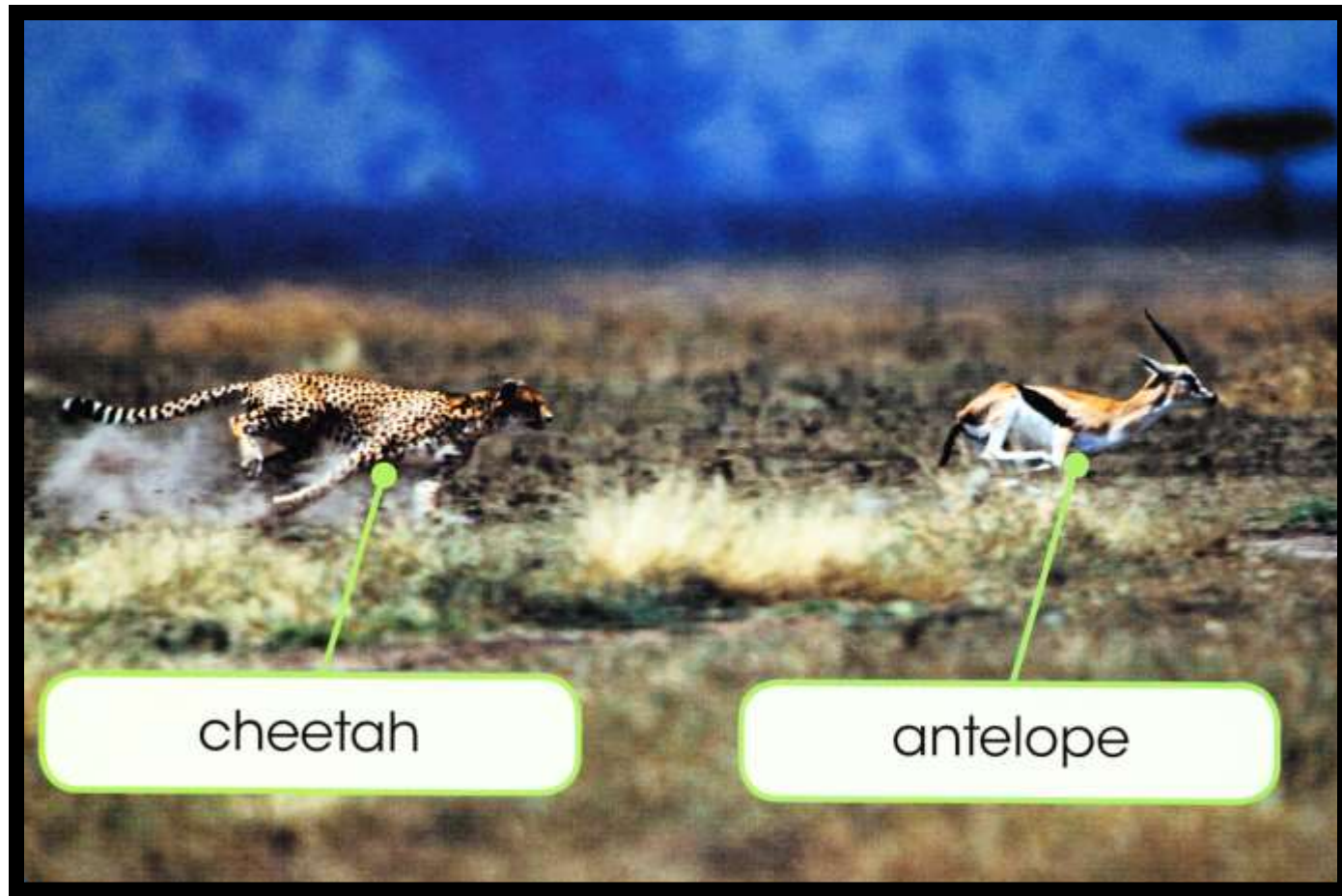


Living things need to eat food and drink water to stay alive.

This statue does not produce waste. The statue is a nonliving thing.

You cannot **grow** a spoon. Spoons are **nonliving** things.
