WOTW 1: narrator (n.) - the voice used by an author to tell/narrate a story. The narrator is often a created identity, and should not automatically be equated with the author.

WOTW 2: text structure (n.) - the author's method of structuring a text; the way a text is structured from beginning to end. In literary works, the structure could include flashback and foreshadowing, for example. In nonfiction works, the structure could include sequence, question-answer, cause-effect, etc.
