WOTW 1: satire (n.) - a literary approach that ridicules or examines human vice or weakness.

WOTW 2: literary nonfiction (n.) - text that includes literary elements and devices usually associated with fiction to report on actual persons, places, or events. Examples include nature and travel text, biography, memoir and the essay.
