

WEEKLY REMINDERS:

1. Nonfiction Outside Reading #2 due November 23rd (Book Jacket) and artistic visual to accompany (food, sculpture, etc. that relates to book). SEE BOOK TALK REQUIREMENTS--BELOW.

WOTW: parallel structure (parallelism) (n) - putting sentence elements or ideas in similar grammatical form. For example: *The best parts about summer are swimming, biking, and sleeping.*

Last week's WOTW: hyperbole (n) - an exaggeration or overstatement

Due Date: Nov. 23rd (Book Talk)

- ❖ Create a book jacket (that actually fits over your book) which includes:
 - Outside
 - new pictures, drawings, symbols that are about the book's contents
 - title, author, publishing company information
 - favorite passage (on back) w/pic of author and short bio info.
 - front AND back are covered and well-designed (and in color)
 - Inside
 - 2 parts
 - inside front--7-10 facts/summary information about book
 - inside back--3-5 personal evaluations (Likes/Dislikes) about book
- ❖ Book Talk
 - 7 minutes long
 - Artistic visual should accompany your talk--it must show time invested and relate directly to the book (food is acceptable but not required)
 - No more than 1-2 minutes used reading from book.
 - Explain Book Jacket
