WOTW (1): inference (n) - a judgment based on reasoning rather than on a direct or explicit statement. A conclusion based on facts or circumstances; understanding gained by “reading between the lines.”

WOTW (2): literary nonfiction (n) - text that includes literary elements and devices usually associated with fiction to report on actual persons, places, or events. Examples include nature and travel text, biography, memoir and the essay.

1. Create a test for the book you read. DO NOT USE ANYONE ELSE'S TEST QUESTIONS! Include a variety of kinds of questions such as true/false (5), multiple choice (3), matching (5), fill-in the blank (2), 1 short answer, and 1 essay. Be creative, but you must have a total of 17 questions, one of which must be an essay. The essay question should be broad enough to require (at least) a two-paragraph answer. Be sure to write clear directions for each section.
2. Attach a completed answer key. (Do this by photocopying or printing out a second copy of the test and filling in your answers on the test, including the minimum requirements for a sample essay answer.) Your test should be typed. Do not plagiarize.
3. You will use this test as the guide to your Book Talk, which will be 7 minutes long on **January 6, 2016**. You will turn this in along with a completed rubric, graded by your peers. Total Value = 75 points
