Period 2, 4, 5, 7:

1. Finish "This I Believe" personal essays by doing the following:
 - a. Check your word count--should be between 500-600 words.
 - b. Make your entire document 1.5 line spacing.
 - c. Make it a size 12 in either Arial or Times New Roman font.
 - d. Insert a Header that includes:
 - i. Single Space it.
 - ii. Right Align it.
 - iii. Your Name.
 - iv. The Date (Feb. 14, 2018)
 - v. This I Believe
 - e. Center your title on first line of paper. Then hit Enter twice.
 - f. Start your paper. Remember to indent paragraphs (and no spaces between paragraphs).
2. After all of this, you must have at least 2 readers who will initial your paper when **we print it**, verifying that it meets all of the guidelines for completion:
 1. Look at rubric.
 2. Set up according to the formatting guidelines above.
 3. Is readable, interesting, mechanically sound, and appears to be of high quality.
