

Steps for Creating the Recommendation Poster

STEP #1: FINISH THE **SUMMARY PARAGRAPH**.

- Must be 3 to 7 sentences.
- Include major plot points and characters.
- Give background of the main conflict in the story.
- Don't reveal the ending or give too much away.

STEP #2: WRITE THE **RECOMMENDATION PARAGRAPH**.

- Must be 3 to 7 sentences.
- State clearly which version you believe is superior.
- Include both the author of the book and the director of the film.
- List three convincing reasons why.
- Explain these reasons.

STEP #3: FIND **OUTSIDE SOURCES (REVIEWS)** TO BACK UP YOUR POINTS.

- Use a website like Rotten Tomatoes (for movies) or Good Reads (for books).
- Find reviews that will help support your stance/persuade your viewer.
- Select effective quotations that you can use in your poster.
- Credit them properly (list author's name and source of review).

STEP #4: ADD **OTHER NECESSARY INFORMATION** TO YOUR POSTER.

- Make sure you have a title that includes your stance.
- Make sure your name and period are on your poster.
- Make sure that you have two pictures on your poster: one of the book cover, one of the movie cover.

STEP #5: ADD **CREATIVE TOUCHES** TO THE POSTER'S DESIGN.

- Choose fonts, colors, and sizes that will make your poster more visually appealing.

STEP #6: **PRINT** POSTERS AND HANG ON BULLETIN BOARD.

- These will be publicly visible, so they must be **perfect!** (No grammar/spelling errors.)
