**WEEKLY REMINDERS:**

**WOTW 1:** meter (n.) - the pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.

**WOTW 2:** text structure (n.) - the author's method of structuring a text; the way a text is structured from beginning to end. In literary works, the structure could include flashback and foreshadowing, for example. In nonfiction works, the structure could include sequence, question-answer, cause-effect, etc.

Period 1:

Period 4:
