WEEKLY REMINDERS:

1. Vocabulary Journals are due tomorrow.

WOTW 1: meter (n.) - the pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.

WOTW 2: text structure (n.) - the author's method of structuring a text; the way a text is structured from beginning to end. In literary works, the structure could include flashback and foreshadowing, for example. In nonfiction works, the structure could include sequence, question-answer, cause-effect, etc.

Period 2, 3, 8:

1. Continue with the Research Process: Google Doc in Research Paper folder.
 1. Locate your 4 reviews (copy and paste the link and the reviews into the doc).

 4. Write Book & Movie Summary. GRADING THESE TODAY.
 5. Write Body 1 and Body 2 sections. **SHOULD BE MOVING BEYOND THIS TODAY.**
 6. Write Body 3 and Body 4 sections (MLA in-text citation). **SHOULD BE HERE NOW. FINISHING...**

 8. Write Works Cited Page (6 sources in MLA format--easybib as a starter; 2 book reviews, 2 movie reviews, book and movie = 6 sources).

Period 4:

 - Look at the manuscript.
 - Begin reading.
