**Period 2, 4, 5, 7:**

1. Review the qualities of a This I Believe personal essay. See wikispace link Personal Essay Writing under the This I Believe link.
2. Read the first link "How To Write a "This I Believe" Essay."
3. Listen to and read Sample 10 "Accomplish Big Things in Small Pieces."
4. Discuss the details that make it a personal essay
  - Something you feel strongly and personally about
  - Uses details that are concrete: appeal to the senses of sight, sound, taste, touch, smell
  - Readers can easily identify your main idea
  - Has a metaphor as an overarching idea
  - Organized like a camera lens: fine detail, then wide, then fine again
5. Then:
  - Create it in your Drive folder. Name it your name.
  - State your belief metaphor in a sentence at the top. Example: "Always Go To the Funeral = Sometimes you have to inconvenience yourself for the good of others."
  - Write your essay, using the instructions (first link on wiki).
