

# Finding Vertex of a Parabola

Maximum or minimum value

- From vertex form:  $y = a(x-h)^2 + k$

Vertex is  $(h, k)$

- From standard form:  $y = ax^2 + bx + c$

$$x_{\text{of vertex}} = \frac{-b}{2a}$$

Plug that  $x$  back into  $y =$

Ex:  $f(x) = x^2 - 4x + 3$

$\rightarrow a=1 \quad b=-4 \quad c=3$

$$x = \frac{-b}{2a} = \frac{-(-4)}{2(1)} = \frac{4}{2} = 2 \rightarrow \text{vertex is } (2, ?)$$

plug  $x=2$  into  $y$

$$f(2) = 2^2 - 4(2) + 3$$

$$= 4 - 8 + 3 = -1 \rightarrow \text{this is the } y\text{-value of vertex}$$

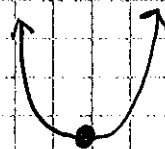

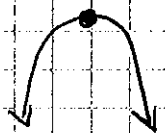
## Is the Vertex a Max or Min?

- Positive a-value → happy opens up



Since the vertex is at the bottom, it's the lowest point or Minimum value

- Negative a-value → sad opens down reflected



Since the vertex is at the top, it's the highest point or Maximum value
