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Teacher Notes:

The HJB book fair family night will be on Wednesday, December 8th from 4 to 7 p.m. There will also be a pancake dinner from 6 to 7 p.m. that same evening. Come out visit the book fair and find lots of new books.

Language Arts:

We have been learning about the letter “s” and our 5 senses. I love teaching the 5 senses; there are so many fun things to do to help the children understand this concept. We made 2 books about our 5 senses. The first book was about popcorn, because we use all of our senses with popcorn. In the book, we also learned about other things that we hear (soft/loud), things that we smell (good/bad), things that we see (straight/curved), things that we touch (soft/hard), and things that we taste (salty/sweet). The other book was blank, and we cut out pictures from magazines; each page was devoted to one sense. We found 3 pictures for each sense page. Please take a look at these books and the other completed projects, and spend some time discussing the 5 senses with your child. The holidays are a great time to look, listen, smell, touch, and my favorite, taste.

Math:

We were able to tie our letter “s” into math by making a snake with numbers. It was a lot of fun to sort ourselves according to what our silly socks looked like. To emphasize our sense of sight, we made a graph about the color of our eyes, and then we tried to throw a bean bag into a bucket with and without our blindfolds. We also began learning about rectangles, and we were able to find lots in our classroom. See how many rectangles you can find in your home.

Other Activities:

In center time, we made shiny stars, sorted pictures according to which for the 5 senses that we use, and wrote letters with smelly soap.
