

Dybboel Mill



- The Mill is built in 1744
- In 1800 the mill was struck by lightning and burned down. It was rebuilt immediately after.
- In both Schleswig wars 1848-50 and 1864 it was destroyed and rebuilt.
- In 1935 it was burned down after a short circuit, but was rebuilt in its present form.
- Until 1990 the mill milled grain.
- Now the mill is used as a museum.



The Battle of Dybboel mill: Dybboel mill was in the middle of 2 wars. The 18 April 1864 accurate at 10 o'clock, 37.000 Prussian soldiers attacked Danish soldiers they were only about 11.000. The danish soldiers stood for 6 hours, then the nearest redoubts were bombed with 7900 grenades from the Prussian batteries which consisted of over 100 canons. The Danish soldiers stood against for 4 hours, before they withdrew to Als.

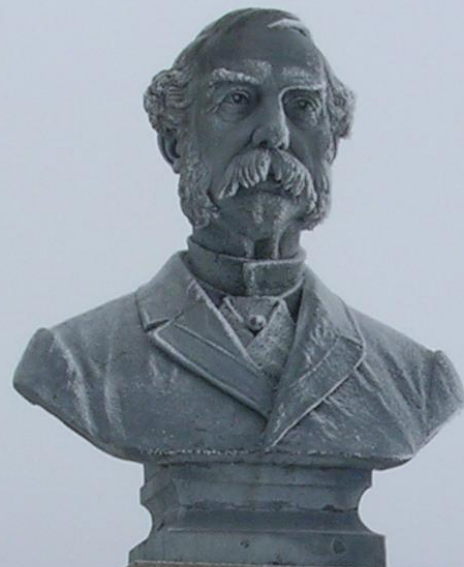
