Reading/Literature

Since the end of the year is coming so quickly, we will be helping Ms. Maneck finish the book *Wonder* during reading. Students will also be using some time during reading to work on their Shakespeare plays.

Language Arts

In May, each class will be reading one of William Shakespeare's classics with the end result being a performance complete with costumes, sets, makeup and music! The plays include *A Midsummer Night's Dream* (5Y), *Hamlet* (5M), *Macbeth* (5P), and *Twelfth Night* (5K).

Math

This week, we will finish up our unit on multiplication and division of fractions and mixed numbers. We will have a test on Thursday and will review in class on Tuesday. We will not have math class on Wednesday or Friday due to the Robert Crown Field Trip and the Transition Picnic. Students are now working on their Million Dollar projects. Projects are due May 22. Science

This week, students will learn about the male and female anatomy in class and will travel to the Robert Crown center on Wednesday. Boys and girls are separated during this field trip. Social Studies

Since students studied the Civil War so extensively in 4th grade, it will not be covered in this year's social studies curriculum. Over the course of the next three weeks, we will be working on a unit titled *The Rise of Big Business & American Innovation*. Students will analyze how technological and scientific developments affected people's lives in the late 1800s. They will conduct a short research project on an influential entrepreneur and be able to explain how that person changed/affected the industries of America.
