READING LOGS

Please be sure that your child is reading 30 minutes each night and responding to what they read in their reading logs.

Students are expected to turn in their logs on Friday. At that time, your child's homeroom teacher checks for 5 complete entries.

Language Arts

Writing Focus: Last week, students began to investigate different famous Americans, so that they could pick one to write a compare/contrast essay about. This week, students must decide on a person to compare themselves too, finish gathering information about that person, and begin writing their essays. The compare/contrast essay is due on March 14th.

Grammar Focus: We will be reviewing grammar skills students have worked on this trimester through Jeopardy-style game on Friday.

Math

This week, we will be reviewing concepts covered earlier in the year, including, fraction addition and subtraction, order of operations and symmetry. In addition, we will practice using the fraction functions of the TI-15 calculator. Students may use calculators on the upcoming ISAT test. It is important that every student have a calculator. We still have calculators available for purchase at a cost of \$16.

Science

In this week's science class, students will be constructing flippers, or catapults. They will then launch corks and evaluate variables to determine which setup will result in the highest launch. It is sure to be an interesting week in class.

Students should now be working on setting up their experiments and collecting data. You can help by making sure that your student is making observations, taking photographs and collecting data on a regular basis. The next major deadline is the March 23 research paper due date. I will be periodically checking progress on Science Fair projects, but for the next several weeks, students should be working on their projects at home.

Social Studies

This week, students will play an online game focusing on the American Revolution. It will allow them to choose characters who might have lived then and learn about their roles. We also will take one more day to reinforce map skills.

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
