After: <i>s, k, f, sh or p</i> it is / <i>t</i> /. For example:	
to ask	asked
to help	helped
to like	liked
to look	looked
to smoke	smoked
to thank	thanked
to walk	walked
to work	worked
He smoked so much last night that he felt sick She worked in a nursery school last year They helped me this morning	
After all the other letters is / <i>d</i> /. For example:	
to answer	answered
to change	changed
to close	closed
to form	formed
to open	opened
to play	played
to question	questioned
to study	studied
to use	used
I answered her email as soon as I could She used your car last night He studied Biology at University
