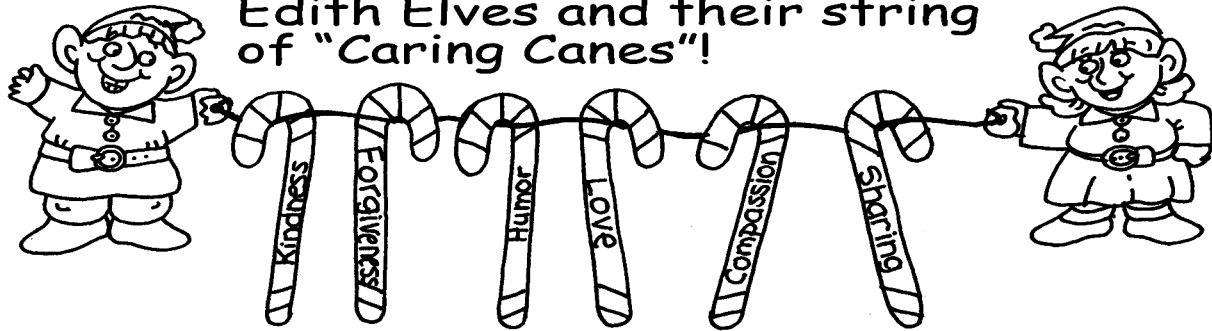

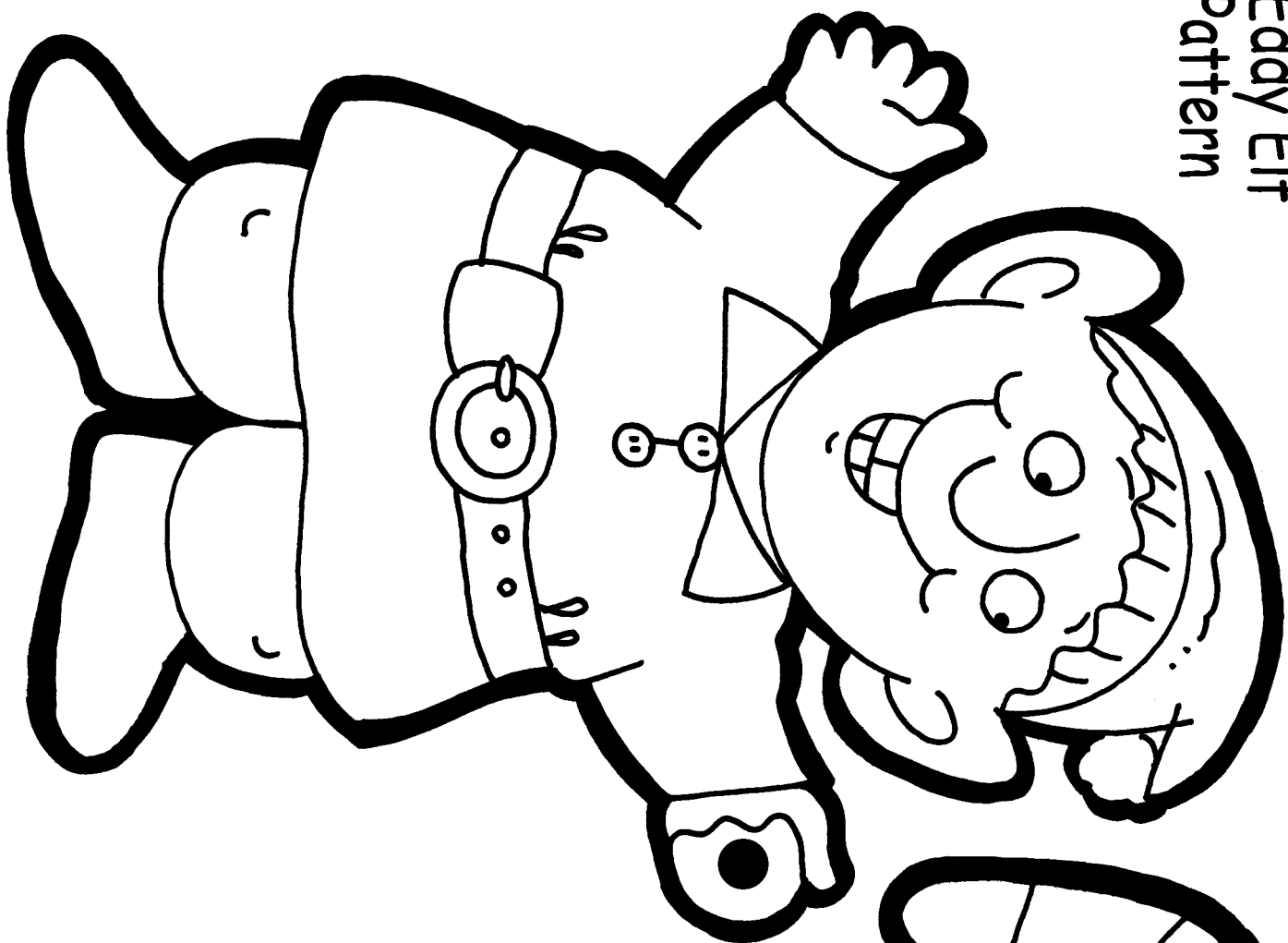
# Caring Canes

Deck the halls... and walls...

of "Caring Canes"!

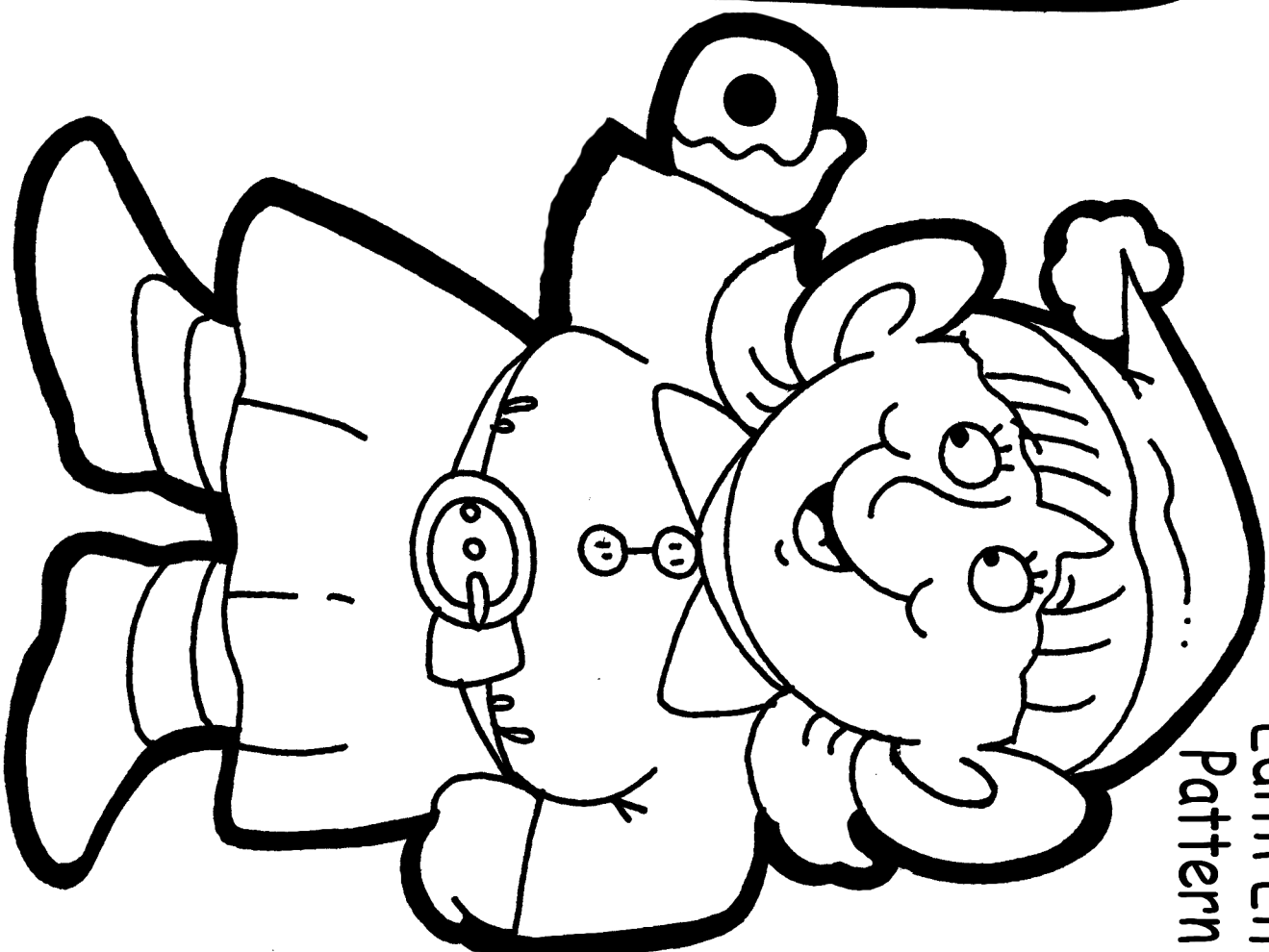


Color and cut out the elf patterns. Punch holes on the black dots of their hands and tie a length of yarn between them as shown. Cut out the candy canes and put them aside (hidden from the children). Tape the elves up in a visible location. As you point to them, tell your students: "Eddy and Edith Elf spend all year making toys for Santa to give to children. But they know the best gift anyone can give is of themselves. I'm going to hand out candy canes to groups. Read the word on your candy cane. Think of a way you can express this idea to someone in your family. In one week we'll start listening to what everyone in each group did!" Let them spend a bit of time decorating the cane as they discuss the definition of their cane's word. Be on hand to help explain if needed. After children tell how they gave the gift of "kindness", or whatever word they were assigned, hang the groups' cane on Eddy and Edith's string. Try to schedule this activity so all canes are displayed by the time students break for Christmas vacation. Consider making a bulletin board where dictations (done by yourself or a helping adult) of the childrens' experiences can be displayed!

# Santa's Sack

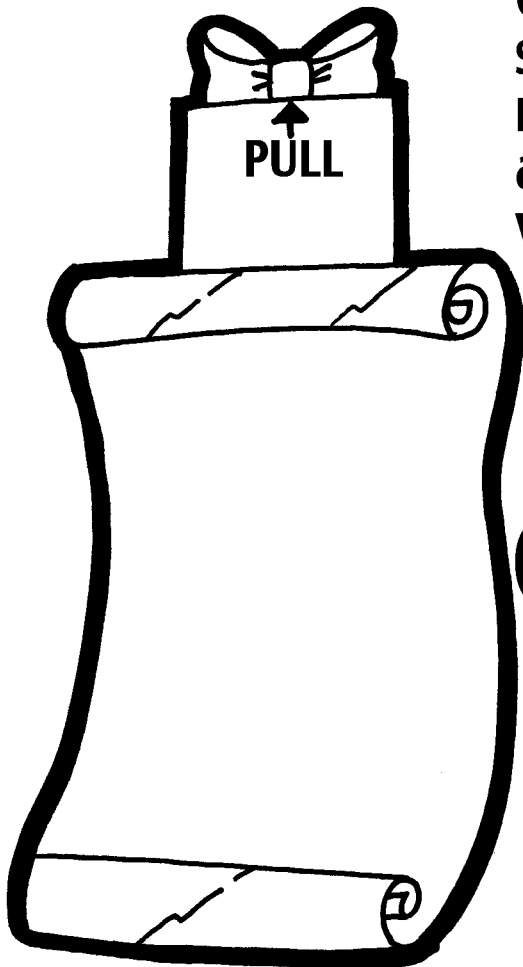

Or... Copy the blank scroll and record letters, numbers, words, etc.. to assist you in teaching various curricula.



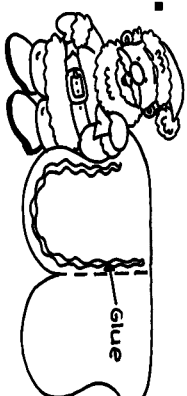

1. Copy and cut out this pattern. 2. Put dots of glue on the line (A.). Fold the right hand side of the sack over and press firmly down to create a "sack". Let Dry. 3. Address the sack and slip the gift and scroll pattern into it as shown (B.). Add other goodies (wrapped candy, "class coupons", etc.) if desired!
