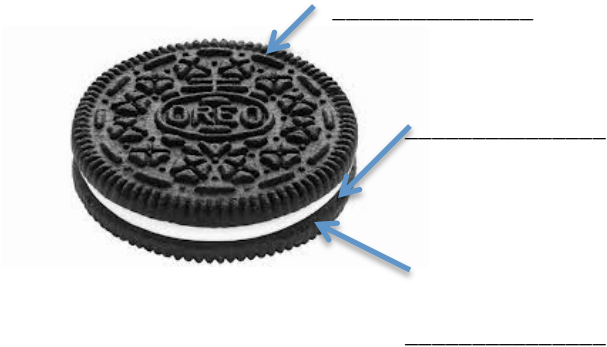

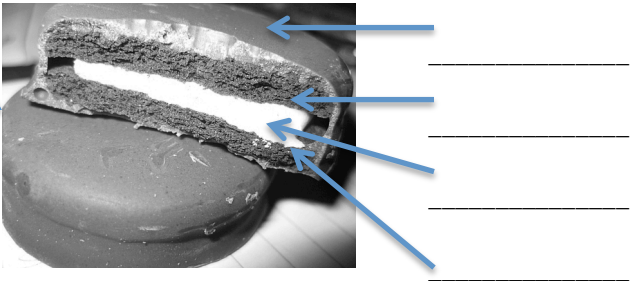
11. Combine the dependent clause and the two independent clauses you wrote for #'s 8-10 to create a **compound-complex sentence**.

Diagram each part of each image to explain how each cookie is like the sentence they represent. Be sure to title each cookie as the sentence they represent. See my example for the fudge.

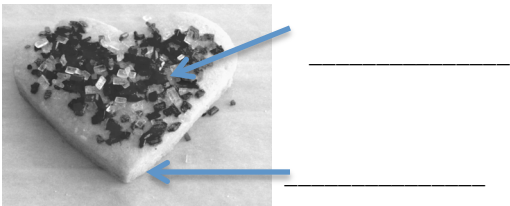

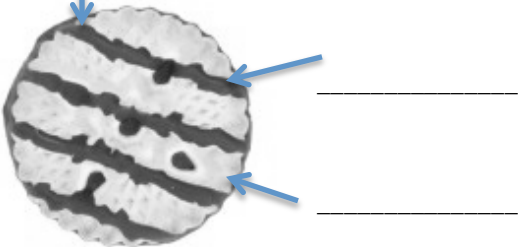
