

IMAGERY JOURNAL EXPECTATIONS:

- You will be **drawing** what you read in each chapter. Your Imagery Journal should have one page dedicated to each chapter for these drawings. You will use blank computer paper for this assignment. There are twelve chapters, so you will need six sheets of paper as you can use both sides. Each page needs to be titled with the chapter #.

Imagery: description used by an author to put an exact image in the reader's mind. The author will use various types of sensory detail in order to do this. (Translation: Draw what you see in your mind as you read. You may need to **reread** passages to comprehend detail. Pay close attention to detail in your drawings.)

- All images must be in color using map pencils.
- Each image must be labeled or captioned.
- Each image must have the page # the image is described on written next to it.
- Each image must be accurately drawn and colored as it is described in the book.
- To make a 70 for each chapter, you must have at least 6 colored images per chapter.
- Images may not be focused on only an isolated part of the chapter. The entire chapter should be represented with images.
- Each chapter will count as a separate daily grade.
- You will be allowed to use your imagery journal on your tests, so draw responsibly (think about what images will actually help you on your test).
