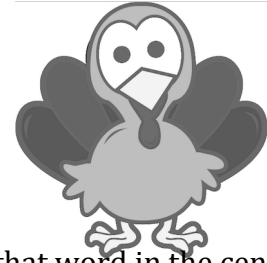


The Monsters are Due on Maple Street

Hand Turkey



1. Trace your hand on the paper.
2. Choose a character: Steve, Don, Woman, Les Goodman, or Charlie
3. Think of an **adjective** that sums up this character in ONE word. Write that word in the center of your hand turkey.
4. Find FOUR direct quotes from the text, *The Monsters are Due on Maple Street*, which proves that word you chose truly sums up the character you chose. Copy the needed parts of the quotes onto each finger. You are copying direct quotes, so be sure to put your direct quotes in quotation marks followed by parenthetical documentation.
5. Add a face and some plumage to your turkey. Think about what your character would like if they were a turkey or maybe a monster turkey.
6. Draw a background that is significant to the character you chose. Give your turkey some textually significant props to carry around. What objects does the character carry around or refer to? What position are their hands, arms, and legs?
7. Give your turkey a thought or voice bubble that sums up their life motto.
8. Your Monster Hand Turkey must be colored.
9. Your Monster Hand Turkey must have your name written on the FRONT.

Examples of direct quotes with parenthetical documentation:

Standard:

"Bilbo got up trembling" (Tolkien 16).

When the pronoun in the original sentence is not clear, a bracket and the name replace the pronoun:

"If [Thorin] had been allowed, he would probably have gone on like this until he was out of breath" (Tolkien 16).

Quote within a Quote:

"Then he fell flat on the floor, and kept on calling out 'struck by lightning, struck by lightning!' over and over again" (Tolkien 17).

Not using the whole sentence:

"... and they went back to their dark business" (Tolkien 17).

" So they took him and laid him out of the way ..." (Tolkien 17).

"... on the drawing room sofa with a drink at his elbow..." (Tolkien 17).

"So they took him and laid him out of the way [...] and they went back to their dark business" (Tolkien 17).
