

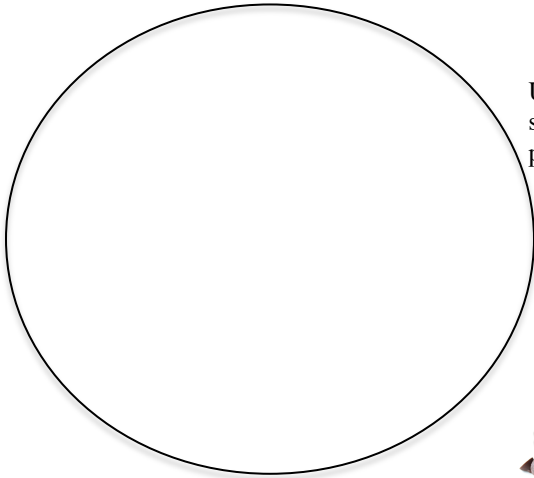

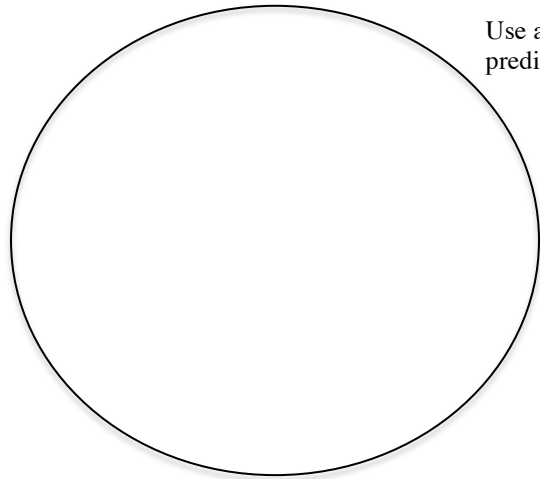

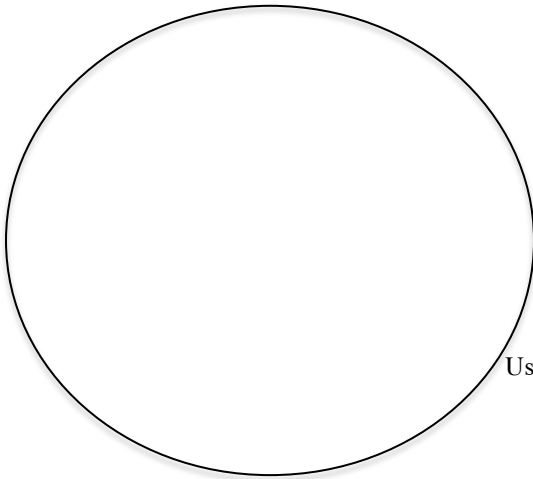
**Simple Sentence-** an independent clause; a sentence that contains a subject and a predicate



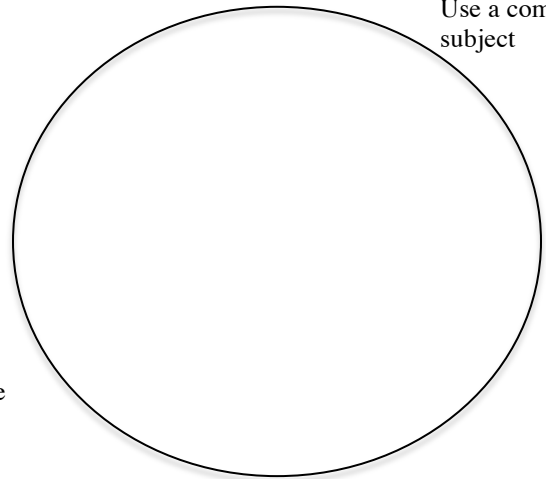

**Complex Sentence-** a sentence that combines an independent clause with a dependent clause

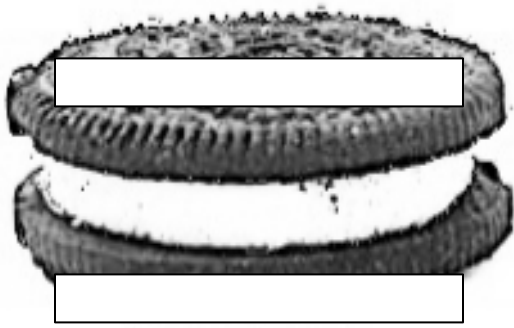

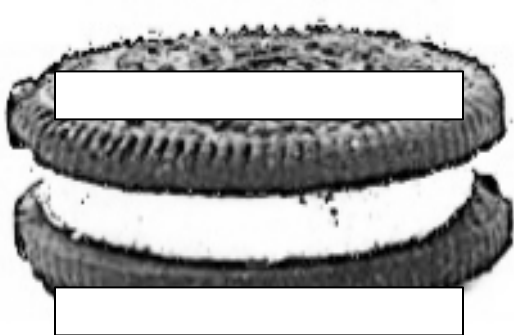

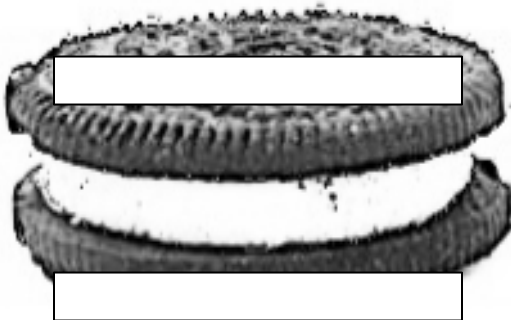
**Compound Sentences-** Two independent clauses joined together using one of the three appropriate conjunctions.

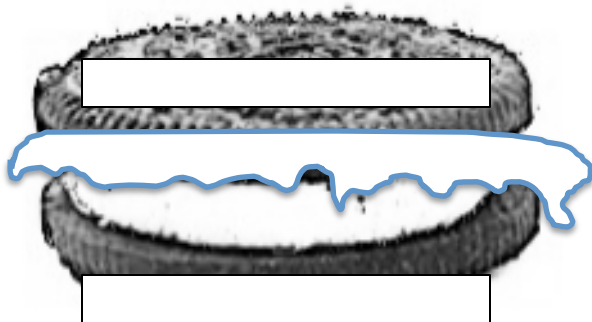
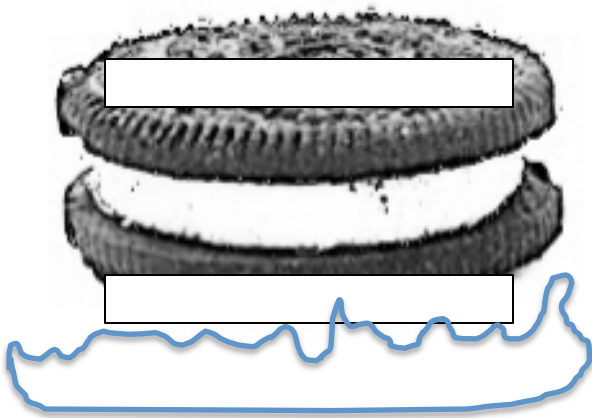
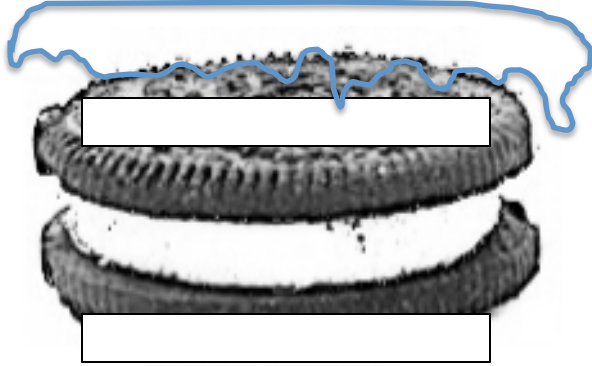
