The Outsiders Soundtrack

Extra Credit Assignment 4th 9 Weeks



You will be making a soundtrack for *The Outsiders* if you want extra credit this 9 weeks.

Step 1: You will think of 12 different songs to represent the events, tone, and mood of the chapters from the book (1 song to represent each chapter). You must also think about and write how each song connects to its designated chapter. Use the chart below as a rough draft.

Step 2: Design the album cover.

Front: Find an old CD case, get some blank paper and design the cover of this album. The album cover must be original artwork and have an original title. You will only use *The Outsiders Soundtrack* as a subtitle.

Middle: On the inside foldout part of the album, you are to have your playlist, the artist, and the song/chapter connections (basically all the information you did in your rough draft).

Back: The back of your album cover will have your playlist and your pretend copyright information. Mimic another album you have, but with your information (your name, 2013, contributors are people who might have helped you or influenced your ideas, etc.)

Things you should know:

You cannot have more than 4 songs that are the same as someone else.

You do not have to actually burn this playlist on a CD.

Extra credit points may not be used to replace a ZERO. They may only be added to other major grades.

How many extra credit major grade points is this project worth?

That depends on how hard I can tell you have worked on this project. I would say that they could have the potential to be exactly what you need. I will be comparing your efforts to the efforts of your peers. You will not earn more points than someone who obviously worked harder than you did. The more creative and detail oriented you are with this project, the more extra credit points you can earn. Impress me!
