# What is Web 2.0, anyway??

- ▶ Web 2.0 is any website that allows interactions of the users and exchange of information. Here are some main examples:
- ▶ Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Flickr, Blogs, Wikis

- ▶ Web 2.0 allows visitors to the site to socialize or make comments about the info on the site . . .
- ▶ Sign up for a Facebook account and start to interact with dozens, if not hundreds of your friends and family either privately or openly with everyone “following” you on the site, for example.

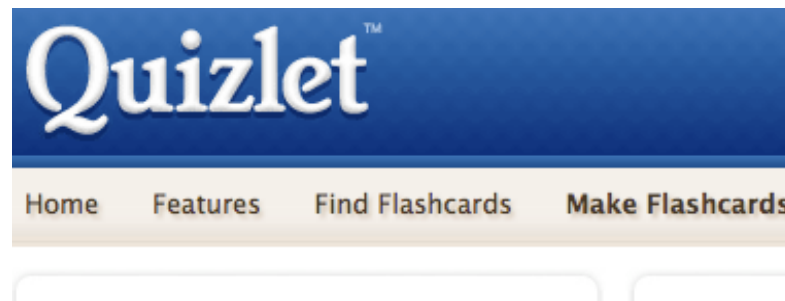
# How is YouTube Web 2.0?

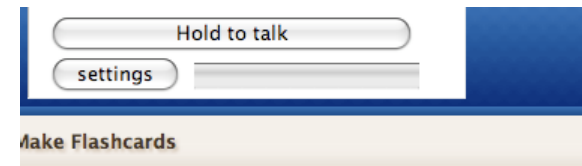

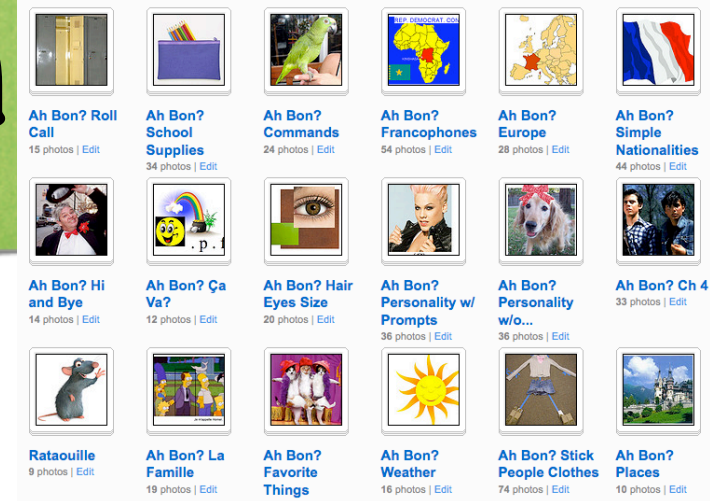

- ▶ Quia is similar to Quizlet, only it's not free.
- ▶ See [Quia.com](http://Quia.com) for more info.
- ▶ I only use Quia for image to vocab matching, but there are amazing opportunities for quizzing students and keeping track of their progress.
- ▶ The advantage Quia has over Quizlet is the ability for user to add images and audios.

# Next is Flickr for image to vocab recognition



- ▶ Flickr.com is free and is a good way to convey vocabulary with images.
- ▶ Students and/or teacher could find images that represent the vocab and share with class.
- ▶ It creates a creative outlet for students to think of the vocab in terms of an image vs. simply words.

# Next: GoAnimate.Com



- ▶ GoAnimate.Com is free and the creative possibilities are mind blowing.
- ▶ Students may upload their own images and audio or may simply use the ones provided.
- ▶ Teachers **MUST** see all tutorial videos provided by goanimate before attempting any type of animation product.
- ▶ It will be worth it!!

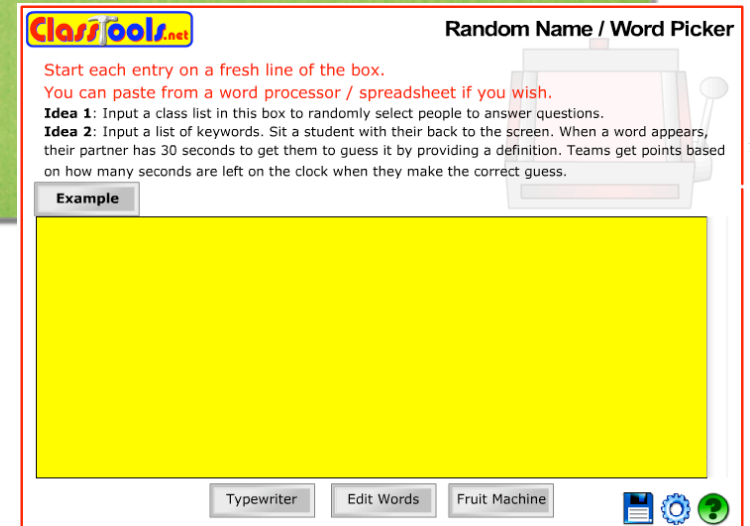

# Don't forget "Random Name Picker"!



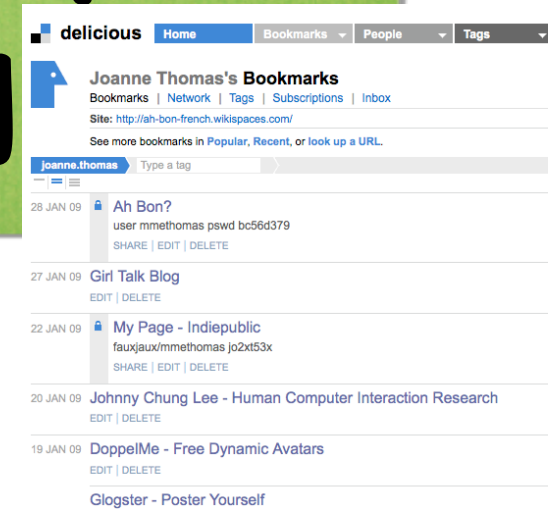
- ▶ On ClassTools.net, look for "Random Name/ Word Picker".
- ▶ Start typing in names or words, hit "fruit machine" and voilà . . . the names or vocab is chosen randomly.
- ▶ Either a student answers a question or a vocab word is chosen to define.

- ▶ Rather than having all your favorite book marks on your toolbar or menu, why not have them online, in case you lose or damage your computer!
- ▶ Share your favs and see what others like, all online and all so easy to find, thanks to tags!

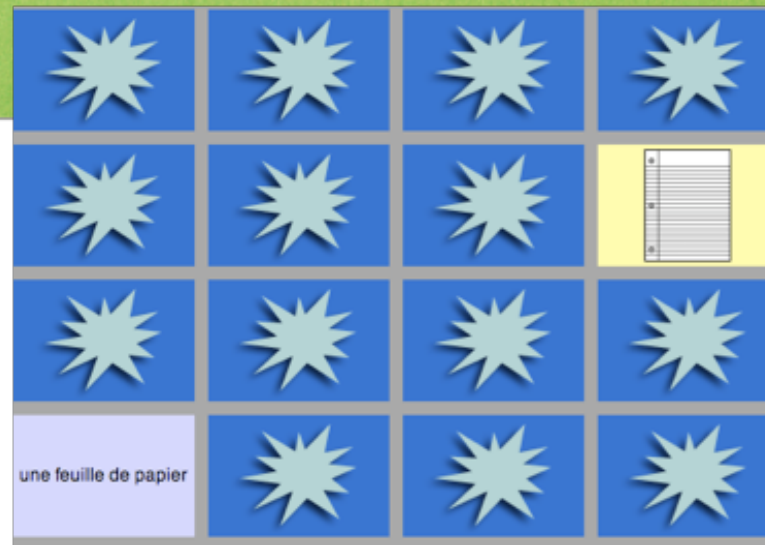




# Students prove they've practiced w/ "Online Proof"

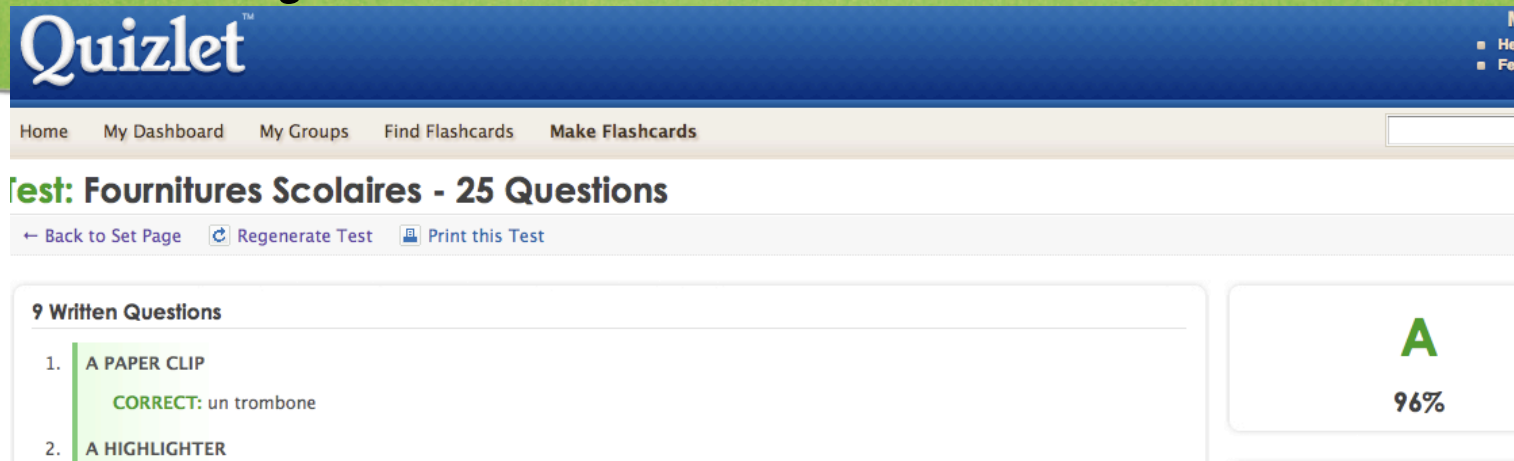
- ▶ Students practice a vocab web2.0 site in class or at home. But how do they prove it??
- ▶ Students take an "image capture" of their score, label it and send it to teacher (e-mail, show on desktop, drop in dropbox).
- ▶ On a Mac, try command shift 4 to do an image capture.
- ▶ It's super fast to grade if the images are all labeled correctly!

# Online Proof Samples



- ▶ Student does a Quia and takes image of last pair. Student labels image w/ class, last name, and type of Quia (6E Thomas School Quia)

# An example from a Quizlet practice test



- ▶ Student takes Quizlet practice quiz, hits “check answers”, gets grade and takes an image of it. Make sure the title is in image.
- ▶ This image is no good. It could be any Quizlet.
