5. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED PARTNERSHIP

5.1 SUMMARY

Summary of the planned Partnership. This description may be used by the European Commission and/or the National Agency when providing information on selected projects, so please be clear and precise and do not exceed 200 words.

This is a project inspired by the concept of scholastic learning by means of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT). It will be interactive, based on the theory of the interactive triangle of Ausubel (1984) where an educational figure is composed of three important vertices: Student, Subject and Teacher. This project will work on the ideas that ICT provoke some processes like the very process of education and learning, reasoning and understanding on the part of the student, and some empirical values in the students. The idea is that the interactive triangle can be transformed into a bigger functional figure: Teacher, Student, Subject and the ICT. The results that can be obtained would be the best example of a new integrated school with a permanent interactive classroom, using the new technologies as a main tool, mainly Internet and some others like web 2.0, in each participating country and all of the countries working together.

5.2 CONTEXT

Each school in take includes some students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

TURKEY.- Our school ğ Ozel Sefkat Ilkogretim Okulu- is in Istanbul, where the two continents meet and greet each other at Bosphorus. Not only natural beauty but also historical aspects of the city are beyond imagination, and visitors always say the same thing: ğIstanbul is the biggest school on Earthğ. We have 182 pupils and 20 teachers. It is one of the oldest and more prestigious private schools of the city . Workshops, work groups, indoor and outdoor activities, computer, foreign language studies are organized . For example: in June 2008, 71 of our students took the international English language exam ğANGLIA- in different levels, and all of them got their certificates with ğdistinctionğ degree. The school has all the facilities and equipment for children having no family members or having almost no financial support. It is a foundation school which was established by 21 distinguished women. Sefkat means ğcompassionğ and ğtoleranceğ, and as a reflection of the name, our school is involved in scientific projects, and social activities supporting human rights. We teach our children how to be the part of the civilised world.

ITALY.- Our School is in Partinico an agricultural village near Palermo .We have 1185 pupils and 110 teachers. It is the oldest and more prestigious High School of classical and scientific studies of the city . Workshops, work groups indoor and outdoor activities, computer, phisics,chemistry,language studies are organized . The School has all the facilities and equipment for our disadvantaged children . In the afternoon there are courses for pupils and adultsğ education . Sports are practised indoor and outdoor,Regional and National competitions have been won by our student.Our best specialities are runnig and athletics, volleyball and basketball.Our School is involved in projects against violence ,organized crime and abuse on Human Being. We teach our pupils PEACE ,TOLERANCE, FREEDOM and DEMOCRACY.

In the village most of the strangers,from North Africa,Albany,Rumania,and SlovaKia,China are employed in agricultural fields or they looking after old people or they work as maid.

THE PLAGUES in our region are 27% of unemployed young people, emigration to the north of Italy and the big phenomena of Mafia.

5.2 CONTEXT

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b) ITALY Our school has few years of experience in partnerships whose results have been positive both for the teachers and the students. They have improved the study of English and the use of new technologies, learned to work on projects. Now with this new project we want to develop in our students self-confidence and awareness of equal opportunities ,enlarge the European dimension ,exchanging visits, cultures, traditions and languages with other countries.

b) TURKEY We organize different activities for our students to improve their experience in life. They are trying to improve the study of foreign languages and the use of developing technologies with each of those activities and projects. And now, with this project, we want to motivate our students to gain ,or regain- their self-confidence and awareness of equal opportunities in life, enlarge their point of view towards European dimension, feeling similarities and differences between cultures, traditions and languages of other countries through exchanging visits, and find solutions to problems with this horizon.

b) DEUTCHLAND.- Our school does;t has experience in partnerships. Now with this project we want to develop in our students self-confidence and awareness of equal opportunities ,enlarge the European dimension ,exchanging visits, cultures, traditions and languages with other countries.

B) SPAIN.- There are some cases of pupils with risk of social exclusion (Spain). IES Felipe de Borbón there are 12% pupils from other countries: Romania, France, Bulgaria, Chine, Ecuador, Marroc, Bolivia, Argentine...

BULGARIA.-We believe that through partnerships with peers from schools in other countries, our students will gain valuable knowledge about different cultures, traditions and educational systems. They will be able to practise what they have learned in the field of Information Technologies, exchange ideas and experiences, make friends, and last but not least, learn the idea of being real European citizens and the responsibility that this whole process entails. Both students and teachers benefit from projects because we get to know each other better, overcome prejudices and learn real values for a better world.
