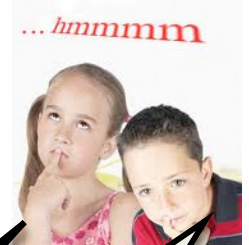
Sounding out parts of words you can hear

Match the look of the word with the sounds you hear.

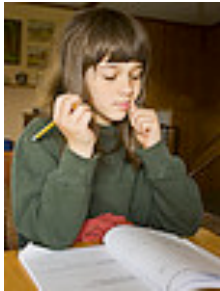
Can you identify the part that doesn't look right? Try some alternatives.
