

## HOW TO CITE A WEBPAGE FROM THE INTERNET:

Author, Institution, Company, or Organization Responsible for the Web Page (if available). (Year, Month Day web page was last updated). Title or description of page. Retrieved Month Day, Year you visited the web site, from: URL (address of web site)

Author: Sometimes the person or group responsible for the web page is hard to determine, but it's important that you figure it out. Check the top and bottom of the web page. Then check the top and bottom of the home page. Then look for a link like "About" or "Contact."



At the bottom of the page you see this. There is no "last updated" information provided:



This example has no author, but it does have an organization. This example also has no updated date. The acronym **n.d.** means no date. The citation would look like:

Natural Resources Defense Council. (n.d.). Stories from the Gulf: Living with the BP oil disaster. Retrieved November 18, 2010, from: <http://www.nrdc.org/storycorps/>

If the webpage had all the information the citation would look like:

Scientist, D. (2010). Stories from the Gulf: Living with the BP oil disaster. Retrieved November 18, 2010, from: <http://www.nrdc.org/storycorps/>

Please note how the title is written: capitals are only used for first word of the titles and for proper nouns.
