

### I. Script Writing

- a. Once have all notes begin script
- b. Most time consuming portion of the project, but also most important. Suggest that you have students turn in work so you can check progress.
- c. Different formats are available on wiki site
- d. **MUST HAVE SCRIPT DONE BEFORE BEGIN PHOTOSTORY Movie project**

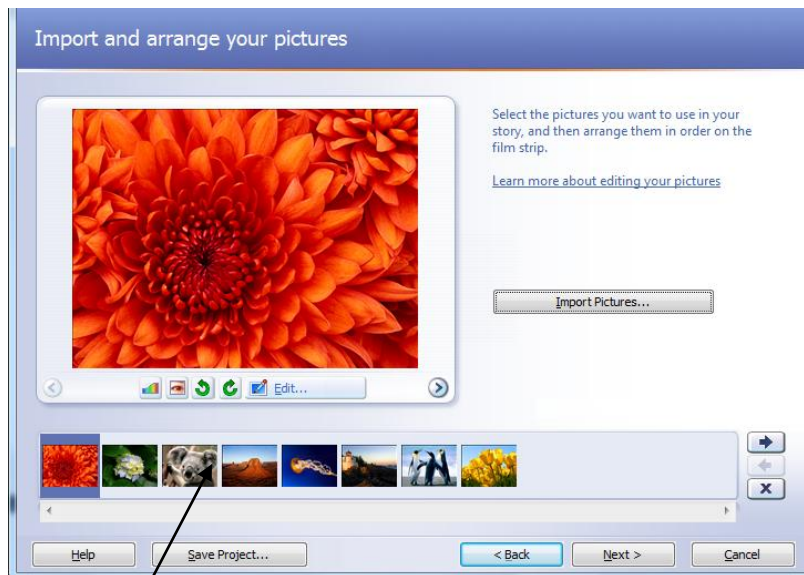
### II. Now that have script completed can move onto to collecting images

- a. Using image websites have students collect 1-2 graphics for each scene.
- b. Teach the students where you want them to save graphics – to desktop or server accounts.
- c. Remind students to refer often to script as selecting graphics. Tell them t feel free to take some artistic license as the graphic will not match exactly. If the report is on George Washington the photo does not have to be of exactly Washington.
- d. Import one slide that is blank piece of paper, preferably colored for opening and closing scene.

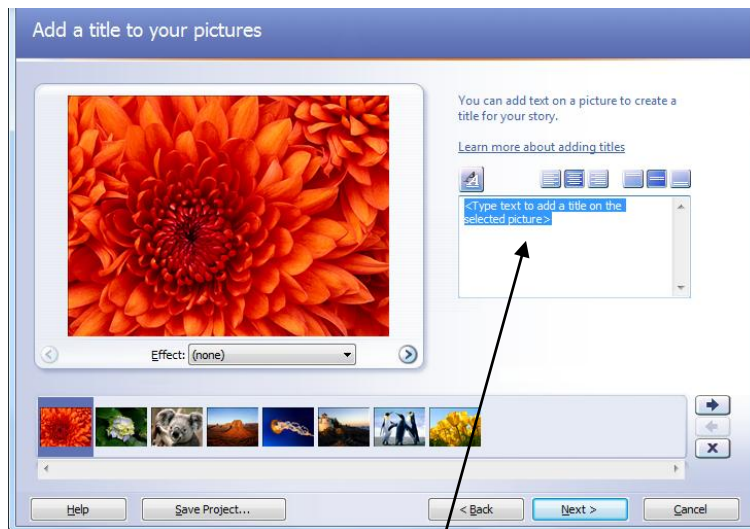
### III. Open PhotoStory

- a. Import all photos at once. Click on Import photos. On left hand side click on location of photos (desktop or computer). Open folder. Click on first photo. Hold down shift and click on last photo and all will import at once into PhotoStory on the timeline.
- b. Edit photos (red eye, contrast, blackline)
- c. Move photos around in timeline to match your script.
- d. Remind the student to save the project often.
- e. Once photos set: click next. Add titles to individual photos. Don't like to do this as distracts from voice, but good of opening and closing slides.





Edits to photos: red eye, rotate, coloring



Add captions or titles to each photo.

#### IV. Record story.

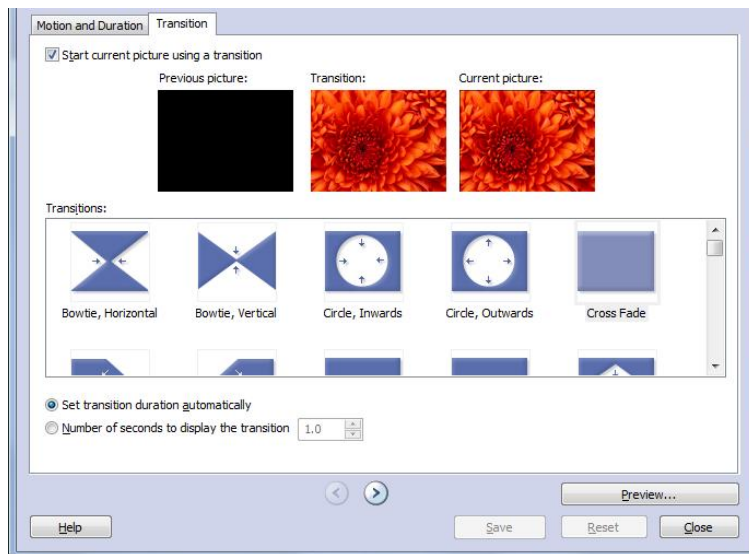
- a. Plug in headset or microphone.
- b. Start recording.
- c. Click preview to see how it sounds. Can rerecord if don't like.
- d. Don't allow the students too much time to record.
- e. But it is very important that their voice be audible.

a. Create music:

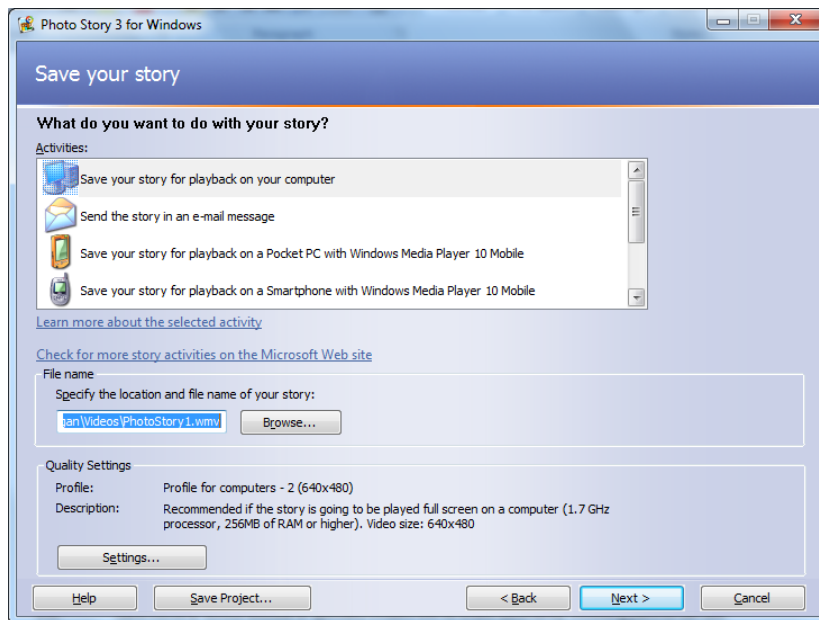
- i. Genre

- b. Be sure to save to the correct location.
- c. Have both the working draft and the final movie finished. Can go back later and modify.
