

Students might also use Dragon Dictation to record their prompt and then paste that into Google Docs for final editing (see Lesson 09 for details).

## Student Copy Text


Copy text by holding on the text, select all and selecting "Copy" from the prompt.





Students upload their Google Document to Evernote.

Students Select The A for Text




## Paste in the Text

- 2) Students "Save"


## Sign into Evernote on your Computer



Using your computer sign into Evernote where you'll be able to view all the student work.


- 1) Select the notebook on the left and then each piece of student work will appear.

## Create an ePub




Copy the student work and paste it into a Pages document on your computer.

## Export



When the student work is in a single document (or as many documents as you would like) select "File > Export" from the computer menu.

## Select ePub



## Select Save Location




Select your save location for the ePub and select "Export."

## Add to iTunes under iBook



Add the ePub book to the iTunes library by dragging and dropping it to the library.

## Sync iPod Touch or iPad and the Book will Appear in iBooks



Your book should sync automatically if you've selected to have all books sync to your device.


If the book doesn't automatically sync then be sure to select it under the 1) "Books" menu of your iPod controls.


This occurs when your 2) iPod is set to sync in iTunes and you select Books.






## Select Your ePub

You can use this to share, revise, edit, teach literary analysis, etc. There are six highlighter colors and the ability to make notes. How about highlighting all similes in purple and metaphors in green? Or highlight a text's topic sentence, strong verbs, etc. There are endless possibilities for using these two features and this really engages the students. They enjoy seeing their writing 'published' and reading their classmates' work as well.
