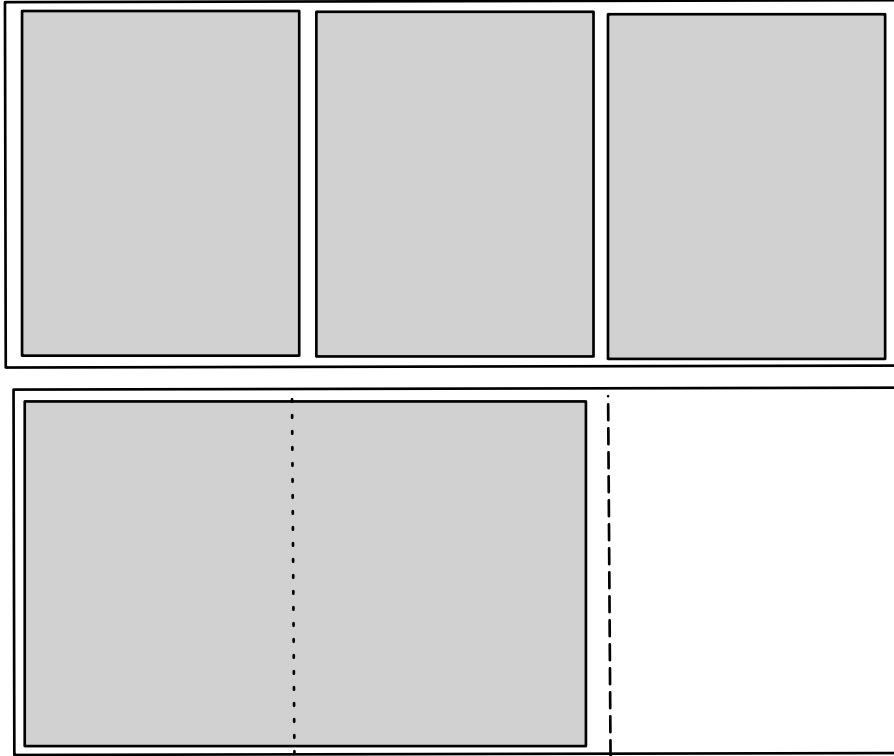


# **3a. Do Si Do Book**

A stitched pamphlet book with two points of view

1. Cut and fold two identical pamphlets. (Don't stitch unless your cover is very thick.)



2. Lay one on the background cardstock, and measure across three pamphlet's wide. Allow a fraction of space between and at the top.

3. Stitch through the center of the first pamphlet and the cover using a simple pamphlet stitch. (If you have chosen a thick cover you will stitch each pamphlet, then glue them in place.)

4. Turn the book over and stitch the second pamphlet in place using the same basic stitch.



## **Writing Ideas Using a Do Si Do Book:**

\* Do-Si-Do books are perfect for **expressing opposing points of view**, for example:

- What would two people think of the same painting, book, or issue?
- What would one artist think of another artist's work if they had very different styles?
- Pose a question and have pairs of students express different views:
  - A. Which is better....(ie: popsicles or ice cream cones)?
  - B. What is more important...(ie: art or music)?
  - C. Who is the best ... (ie: composer: John Lennon or Mozart)?
  - D. Which is your favorite....(ie: dogs or cats?)
