



## 10 Uses for a Classroom Interactive Whiteboard

Get the most out of your interactive whiteboard solution (IWB) and jump start your interactive teaching with this list of 10 practical ways to use your IWB for a variety of classroom activities.

- ☐ **Record your lesson** using the interactive record feature. Send out recording to students and parents for later review. Or, post recording on your school webpage.
- ☐ **Create a pictorial map of events** by having students drag related icons to the correct location on a timeline for a given historical time period.
- ☐ **Match famous pieces of art to their corresponding art movement** by having students drag and drop images into category quadrants.
- ☐ **Build sentences with correct grammar** by having students drag words from a pool of color-coded parts of speech.
- ☐ **Replay the various steps of a complex algebraic or chemical equation** by using the playback tool feature.
- ☐ **Compose a major or minor chord** using the music staff template and have students come up and circle a given chord. Or, have students draw in their own chords.
- ☐ **Arrange the planets in our solar system** in correct order by having students manipulate various solar system gallery images.
- ☐ **Review class attendance interactively** by posting a bird's eye seating chart on the board and have students initial their seat as they walk in. Move names around to change seating chart on the fly.
- ☐ **Administer a timed quiz or test** using a stopwatch flash tool on the board so that everyone can see how much time is left.
- ☐ **Translate foreign words** by having students drag and drop objects. Set the correct word objects to appear on top of a square object when dragged over. Set the incorrect word objects to hide behind the square object.
