Major Conflict: Noah is uncertain about him and Paul's relationship. When Noah and Paul meet up to talk about their issues, Noah finds out about Paul's kiss with his ex-boyfriend, Kyle. They don't talk for weeks, and Noah continues to ignore Paul.

Rising Action: Paul, Tony, and Joni--three best friends are sitting at a book store. Suddenly, Paul notices Noah and discover that they go to the same school. Paul is instantly in love with Noah, and they start to date when they meet at school. Joni starts to date Chuck after breaking up with Ted (her long-term boyfriend).

Climax: Tony is having difficulty with his parents because of his strictly religious parents, so him and Paul decide to go to the woods to talk hug. Paul gives a friendly hug, but right then, Tony's mother's best friend spreads the word. The school is misinformed and rumors about them form,

causing Noah to get mad. Noah and Paul talk about it, but Paul slips and tells Noah that he kissed Kyle. Kyle and Paul don't talk for week.

Falling Action: Paul talks to Tony, his best friend, about what to do. Tony tells him to show Noah that he loves him rather than try and talk to him. Noah realizes how much he loves Paul, and they get back together.

Foreshadowing: The uncertainty of Noah's feelings foreshadow that their relationship may not work out. Also, Noah wasn't even sure about being so open about his gay stance--foreshadowing a major conflict.

Character List

Paul – As a typical sophomore in a high school in a little town, he realized that he is gay when he was five years old. Even though he is average height and is not really fashionable, he has had many boyfriends because of his cute appearance. Paul grew up in a liberal town under parents who were always accepting his homosexuality, thus living a lucky life

Noah – Noah is a new student to Paul's high school. He has pointy hair, green eyes, and a littler birthmark on his neck. He is an arty person, who has his own painting room in his house that his family members are prohibited from entering.

Joni – Joni was Paul's best friend since first grade. Joni was the first person Paul ever came out to except his parents, and since then they have been best friends. Described as a cheerful, pretty girl who knows almost everyone in their school, Joni would have done anything to help her best friend.

Kyle – He is Paul's ex-boyfriend, who ended the relationship with Kyle on his own. He is the one that hurt Paul before, that made him to be careful to love someone ever again. Kyle later shows his love toward Paul again, telling him how much he regretted after he broke up with Paul.

Infinite Darlene – She is the high school football quarter back and the homecoming queen. Infinite Darlene is a drag queen, who is really close with Paul. She is buff and tall in skirts, but no one seems to care in this town. She is always there for Paul, and her poppy comments often contain valuable advices.

Tony - Paul's best friend who is also homosexual. Tony has the sweetest smile ever, and he is the one who is thoughtful, and who knows how to listen to the others. H. Grown up under strict parents, Tony never got to hang out with boys because his parents don't want to accept that Tony is homosexual.

Chuck – Joni's boyfriend. He is described as a buff, tall, an athletic-looking boy. He plays second string quarterback, and is not welcomed by many people. He is famous for talking about someone behind the back, which is the main reason for many people's hatred.

Major Character Analysis:

Paul – Paul is too ordinary to be special, and too special to be ordinary. He is neither a superman nor a magician. He is a typical boy who lives in a small town, who cries, who smiles, who hangs out with his friends, and who loves. Sometimes he makes stupid decisions that ruin his relationships and regrets. This doesn't necessarily mean Paul is neither stupid nor unintelligent, but simply shows the author's intention to create a typical teenage boy. Yet Paul is special. He is

special in a way that he is accepted in his society as a homosexual. Paul believes in his instincts most of the times, which sometimes don't work out. Paul is scared to pursue his love because he is afraid to get hurt. But this time, after meeting Noah, he starts to believe that "happily ever after" is actually possible.

Noah –Noah caught Paul's attention from the beginning. Maybe it is because of his appearance, but mostly because of his atmosphere. As an artist, he has a sweet look on his face along with deep eyes. Noah is a person with deep thoughts, who wants to be careful before taking any actions. Noah wants to be careful when starting a relationship because he has been hurt before and doesn't want to go through that again. Even though he has feelings for Paul, Noah doesn't want to show it so easily because he is also afraid to get hurt.

Joni – She is the one who would always stand up for her best friend. But for some reason she changed. After she goes out with Chuck, she prioritizes her relationship with Chuck more than the friendship. Joni's friendship with Paul was well-known to all people as the one that would last forever. But because Joni believes that Paul disapproves her relationship with Chuck, she gets defensive and she is willing to give up her friendship for Chuck. This shows her devotion to love, but also her perception of love overcoming friendship.

Tony – Tony is probably the most insightful person in this novel. Tony knows how to listen to his people. Joni and Paul always talk to Tony whenever they have any problems. Tony is always there for them not to give them the right answer, but to guide them to it. But Tony has his own

problems as well, which this time, his friends step up to help him. His strict parents don't want to accept that Tony is homosexual, and Tony doesn't know how to persuade his parents. Tony feels weak in front of his parents, not knowing how to express what he wants. But Tony finally learns out to raise his voice to get what he wants.

Important Quotations

I think he's wonderful. He's holding a book out to me. *Migraines Are Only in Your Mind*. I am aware of my breathing. I am aware of my heartbeat. I am aware that my shirt is half untucked. I take the book from him and say thanks.

Explanation of the first quote: This is Paul's description of Noah and how he felt when he first saw him. This is the start of everything. This is the start of happiness, smiles, laughter, tears, frustration and all. Because Paul feels a connection with Noah from their first encounter, they look for each other at school. They can't keep their eyes off of each other. This is the start of everything.

In contrast, every plan Joni and Chuck mention starts with the word we. Usually Joni and I would plan a point to connect over the weekend. This time, neither of us makes that move. I notice this. I wonder if she does, too.

Explanation of the second quote: Joni and Paul were best friends that met up every weekend. But after Joni started going out with Chuck, their tradition broke. Paul feels betrayed, as if Joni

chose Chuck over Paul. Joni doesn't want to lose neither Chuck nor Paul, but if she has to choose, she is willing to choose Chuck over Paul. This quote shows the main theme of love overcoming the friendship. There are different people in this world, and some people are definitely willing to choose one over another.

"I didn't kiss Tony. Is *that* what you heard? Oh, God! I was in the park with him yesterday and gave him a hug because he was bummed out. That's all" I figure this will clear things up. But Noah looks more confused than ever. "So who did you kiss this morning, then?" He asks. Gulp. Stupid. Stupid. Stupid. "Kyle?" I say. "Your ex-boyfriend Kyle?" I nod. Now it's Noah who's laughing.

Explanation of third quote: Paul shouldn't have kissed Kyle. But it is what happened and Paul is confessing the truth. Noah didn't want to start the relationship with Paul because he was afraid that something like this would happen to them. That he would get hurt. This is the turning point where boy loses boy. It seems like Paul cheated on Noah, whether it is true or not. Paul tries hard from this moment to win Noah back, where he proves his dedication and love toward Noah through his effort and time consumption. This also is correlated with the theme of effort changing the result.

He has kept all this white noise inside him, and now some of it is coming out. I move over to him and hug him tight. I tell him that he's brave. I tell him that he's done it – he's taken not the first up but the next step.

Explanation of the fourth quote: Tony has been suppressed by his parents to shows his homosexuality. But finally with Paul's support, he decides to stand tall against his parents to tell them that he is gay and it is nothing to be embarrassed of. Tony feels proud that he had the courage to present his homosexuality to his parents, and Paul also applauds his bravery. Tony is finally taking the first step to be happy.

Explanation of the fifth quote: This is the last sentence of this entire novel. It shows how the theme of many fairy tales also applies here. "And they lived happily ever after." Even though Paul and Noah went through some hardships and difficulties regarding their relationship, they are both happy now and a bright, joyful future awaits them. Paul and Noah lived happily ever after.

Themes

Efforts do change results

"Don't tell him, Paul. Show him." "And how do I do that?" Tony shakes his head. "I'm not going to tell you. But I have a feeling that if you think hard about it, you'll figure out how to do it. If you want to be loved, be lovable."

When Paul tells Tony about Noah, Tony suggests to Paul to show his love towards Noah then Noah will love him back. Actions sometimes can show more efforts and sincere rather than just words. Noah would open um his mind towards Paul by showing his love through actions.

“Because I now that as well as giving him the flowers, I am giving him the time it takes to make them. With every fold, I am giving him seconds of my life. With every flower, part of a minute.”

Devoting one’s time and money really shows how much he or she wants it. Paul is putting his time to fold flowers with papers to give them to Noah. By doing this, Paul shows how much he is attempting to get Noah back. Noah starts to reveal his heart little by little and starts speaking to Paul again. As a result, this shows the theme of efforts changing results.

Relationship is never easy.

“I miss Joni. I miss Noah. I don’t really miss Kyle, but he’s the one who finds me.”

This part well describes how Paul misses his best friend and his love that he has lost in the last few days. The reason for this chaos was because of many struggles that he went through. However, this all shows how friendship and love can be hard sometimes.

“If I were bigger, I swear I’d beat the crap out of you.”

This quote tells how Noah’s sister Claudia is mad about Paul because he hurt Noah. After all those warnings that she told Paul not to hurt Noah, it is reasonable that she is mad at Paul. Symbols:

The seventh day

Green envelope
