Be prepared for a challenging class that will require you to think critically and apply what you have learned. After this class, I hope to prepare you for college and life after High School.

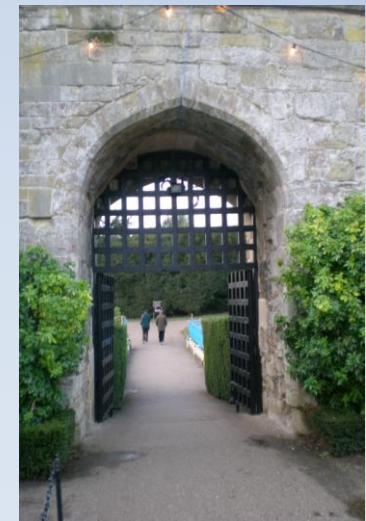
