

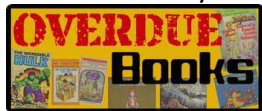

May 16: ALL library books are due!

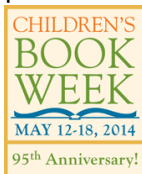
May 12-16: Children's Book Week celebrated.

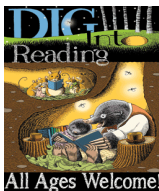
