This Rubric gives an idea of how WIKIs can be used well - aim for NUMBER 4 at all times!

<b>Idea &amp; Content</b>	Your posts are short and are frequently irrelevant to the events. They do not express opinion clearly and show little understanding.	Your posts show some insight, depth & are connected with events, topic, or activity. Posts are typically short and may contain some irrelevant material. Posts show some consideration of the audience.	Posts show insight & depth. The content of posts are connected with events, topic or activity. Posts may contain some irrelevant material but are for the most part, on task. Personal opinions are expressed in an appropriate style. Your posts show a good understanding of audience.	Posts show insight, depth & understanding. They are connected with events, topic or activity. Entries are relevant with links made to supporting materials. Personal opinions are expressed in an appropriate style & are clearly related to the topic, activity or process. Posts and opinions show a high level of understanding and they relate to events, learning activities and processes. You have clearly considered the audience for this work.
<b>Commenting</b>	No comments on others' work are made. You do not reply to comments made on your work.	When people comment on your work you give basic replies (i.e. one or two words), but you don't comment on any else's work.	The reply shows understanding. You reply to some other people's comments. You do not consider the suggestions given by others.	You comment on the work of others on the wiki. Comments are replied to in a timely manner. Your replies show a depth of understanding and relate to the comments. You are able to carefully consider the suggestions you are given by other wiki members.
<b>Quality</b>	Posts are of very poor quality. There is little to no evidence of editing and/or you repeat a large amount of existing content on the wiki.	Posts show an overly casual writing style. You pay little attention to editing and/or your work repeats some content that already exists on the wiki.	Posts use formal writing style. The content demonstrates that you have read and considered existing wiki content and are adding to or enhancing it.	Posts are well-written, clear and concise. The content is important, relevant and meaningful. You have clearly considered existing wiki content and have significantly added to the value of the wiki
<b>Use of Enhancements</b>	You have added no multi-media enhancements or visual imagery to your posts.	There is very little evidence of multimedia enhancement and your posts are primarily text-based.	You have enhanced your post a little, using video, audio, images or other add-ons.	You have greatly enhanced your wiki post using video, audio, images or other add-ons that made the post more understandable to the audience.
