To Kill a Mockingbird

Harper Lee published her first -- and only -- novel July 11, 1960. It was awarded the [Pulitzer Prize for Fiction](#) in 1961 and was made into an [award-winning film](#) in 1962. It rapidly became one of the most often-taught novels in American public schools, and in 1999 was voted "[Best Novel of the Century](#)."

Mockingbird is also an [often-challenged](#) novel. Some parents object to the use of profanity, to the novel's depiction of racism, and to the presence of the n-word -- the same one that appears so often in *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*.

This summer is a good time to look at the novel again. Have you taught it several times already? How might you update your approach? Will you teach it for the first or second time this coming school year? How can you use this
