
What is Moodle?

According to <http://moodle.org> **"Moodle"** is a software package for producing Internet-based courses and web site development project designed to support a social constructionist framework of education.

Moodle is provided freely as Open Source software (under the GNU Public License). Basically this means Moodle is that you have additional freedoms. You are allowed to copy, use and modify Moodle provided that you agree to: **source to others; not modify or remove the original license and copyrights, and apply this same license to work.** Read the [license](#) for full details and please contact the [copyright holder](#) directly if you have any questions.

The word Moodle was originally an acronym for Modular Object-Oriented Dynamic Learning Environment, which is a programming language for programmers and education theorists. It's also a verb that describes the process of lazily meandering through something as it occurs to you to do them, an enjoyable tinkering that often leads to insight and creativity. As such it is the way Moodle was developed, and to the way a student or teacher might approach studying or teaching an online course. Anyone who uses Moodle is a "Moodler."

When you are finished exploring the Moodle course, don't forget to log out before exiting the course.
