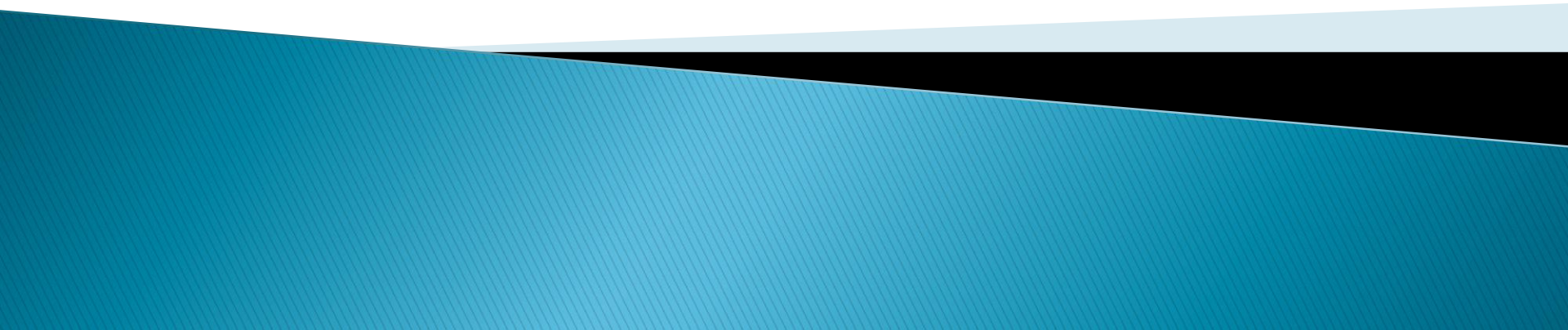

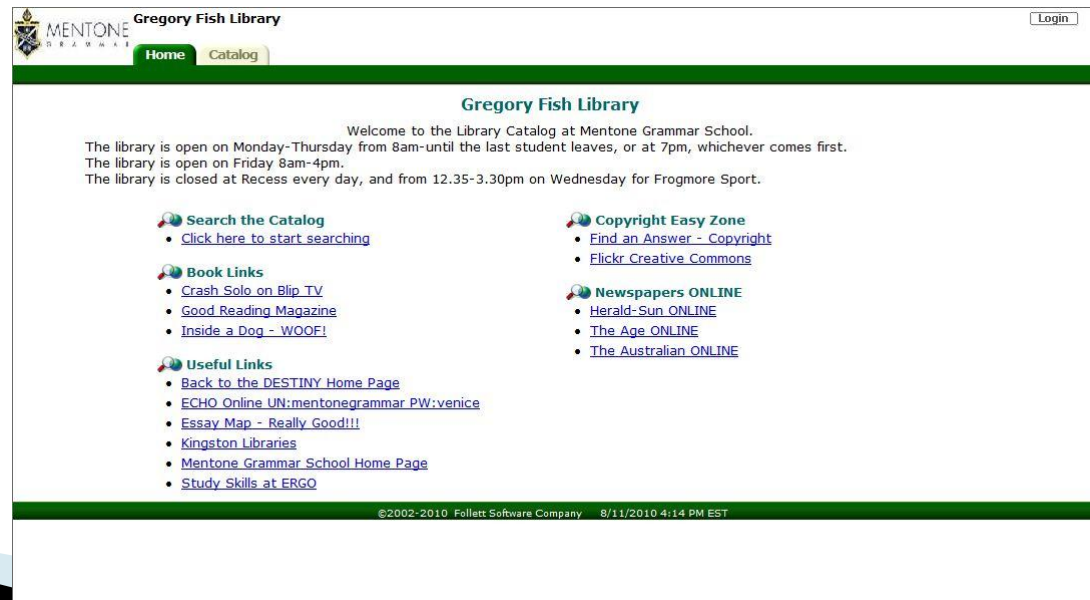
# Keywords and Key ideas



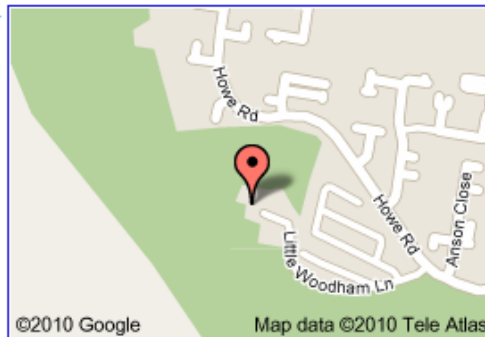

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

# Read and Take Notes

- ▶ Information doesn't 'soak' into your head through your eyes.
  - ▶ Look at your questions and skim read the article to find what you need.
  - ▶ Record the URL of the website and the date you looked at it.
    - Use a Word document to collate your URL information. Just copy and paste.
- 

# Bibliography

- ▶ Bibliographies? Citations? (Huh?!)
  - We use a bibliography to acknowledge other people's work, and to pass!
- ▶ It's easy if you've kept this information in a Word document while searching.
- ▶ Use Word/ References/ Add Citation to keep them organised.

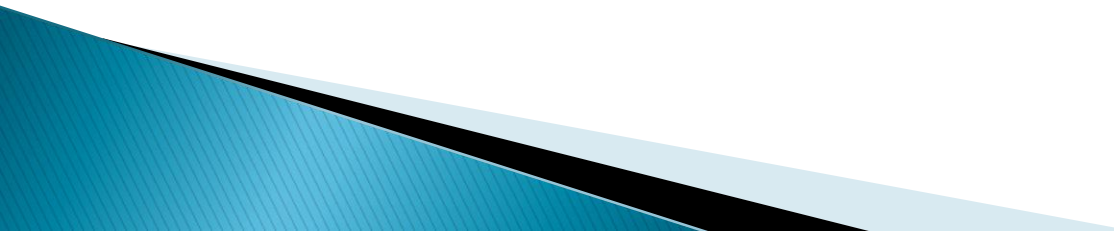
