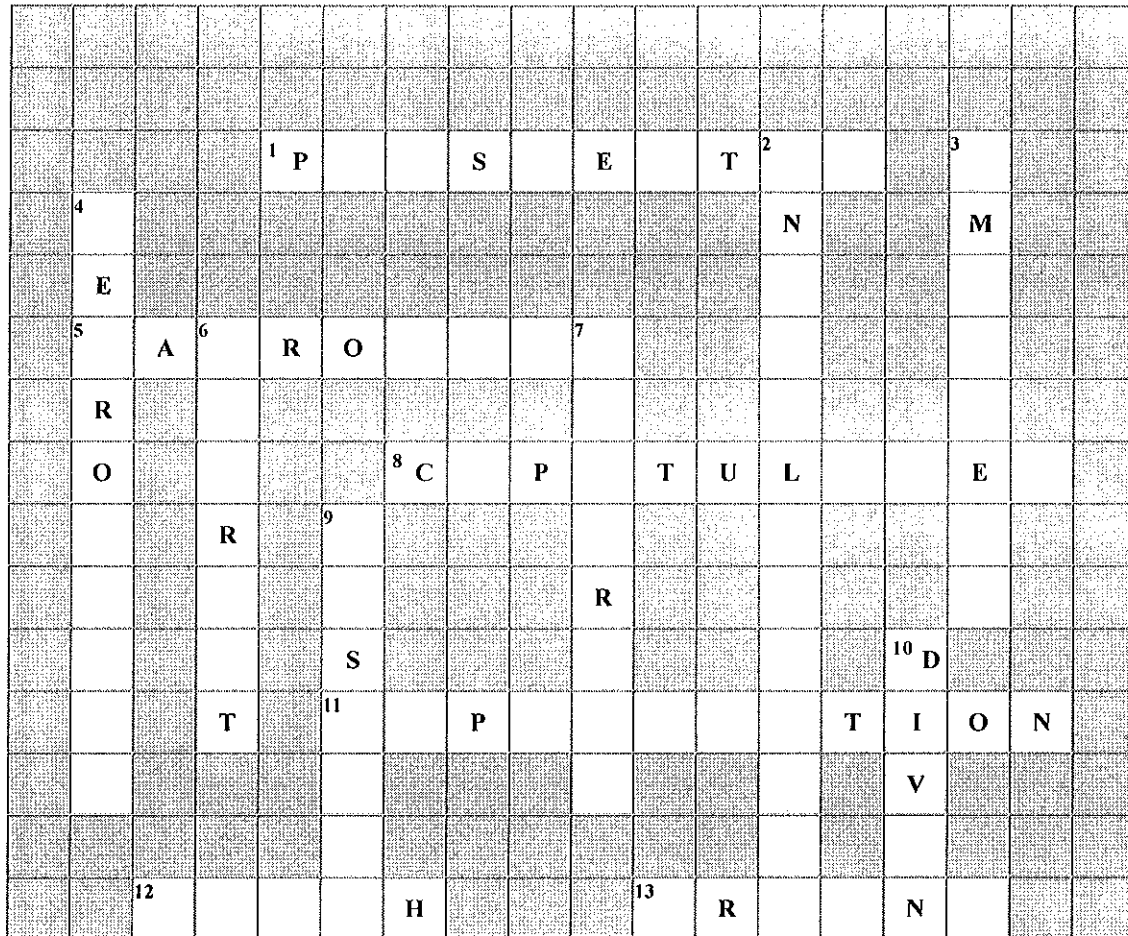

1. Create a timeline for all of the significant events that took place throughout the course of Anne's diary. Use direct quotes from her diary to enhance your presentation.
2. Write a research paper on the Holocaust and how Jews and other victims were treated during the Holocaust. How and why did Hitler and the Nazi supporters use Jews as scapegoats?
3. Define prejudice, stereotypes, and scapegoats. Discuss examples of each in today's society. Explain why prejudice can be dangerous and what groups have been victims of prejudice over the course of history. Where do prejudices come from? What can we do to get rid of prejudice?
4. A central theme of Anne Frank's autobiography is her discoveries of, and her encounters with, love. Ironically, in one of her first entries (June 30, 1942) she wrote, "Love finds a way." Write an essay that discusses her discovery of love and the people and things that inspired her to love.
5. Create a 3-D model of the building that the Franks, the Van Daans, and Mr. Dussel lived in for two years. Make sure that your model is accompanied by an explanation of some of the significant events that took place in the various parts of the building.
6. Despite the fact that Anne was in her early teens, she wrote some philosophies that were very wise for her age. For example, on September 28, 1942, she noted that "people who blush get so hot and excited, it is quite a handicap in such a situation." In the same entry she states that "you only really get to know people when you've had a jolly good row with them. Then and then only can you judge their true characters!" Create a booklet of Anne's philosophies and give it an appropriate title.
7. Write an essay that compares and contrasts Anne Frank from today's teenage girl.
8. In her February 23, 1944 entry, Anne writes the following paragraph: The best remedy for those who are afraid, lonely, or unhappy is to go outside, somewhere where they can be quite alone with the heavens, nature, and God. Because only then does one feel that all is as it should be and that God wishes to see people happy, amidst the simple beauty of Nature. As long as this exists, and it

certainly always will, I know that then there will always be comfort for every sorrow, whatever the circumstances may be. And I firmly believe that nature brings solace in all troubles. Using Anne's attitude towards the environment, write an editorial, from her point of view, which incorporates her experiences, expressing her opinions on the state of our environment today.

9. Watch a movie version of *The Diary of Anne Frank* and compare and contrast it to *The Diary of a Young Girl*.

10. *The Diary of a Young Girl* only develops the two years of Anne Frank's life in which she was in hiding. Do additional research and write a report on her life before the war, and what happened to her after she was captured.

11. On Monday, May 22, 1944, Anne wrote:
Is discord going to show itself while we are still fighting, is the Jew once again worth less than another? Oh, it is sad, very sad, that once more, for the umpteenth time, the old truth is confirmed: "What one Christian does is his own responsibility, what one Jew does is thrown back at all Jews."
Examine world religions today and the positive and negative interactions that take place between them. Write a thesis paper on how much you think things have changed or remained the same since Anne wrote her diary.
