

TERMS & CONDITIONS

PAYMENT SCHEDULE

\$400 is due with application. A second payment of \$800 is due **January 5, 2007**. Final payment will be due on **Friday, March 30, 2007**. If any currency or airfare assessment (other than fuel surcharges) needs to be made, it will be made by March 1, 2007. Any late payments will result in a \$25 fee. All checks/money orders should be made payable to CETA Tours. We do not accept credit cards.

CANCELLATION POLICY

All cancellations must be in writing. Postmark date will be considered the valid date of cancellation. After enrollment, should you decide to cancel at any time up until December 31, 2006 there will be a \$75 administrative fee. Cancellation penalty from January 1 - March 29, 2007 will be \$400. March 30, 2007 to 31 days prior to departure the cancellation penalty will be \$400 plus any non-recoverable expenses. 30 days or less prior to departure, no refund possible. Any airline penalty would be in addition to the above. The cancellation penalty and charges for lost deposits may be waived, if an acceptable, eligible substitute is found. Airline penalties, however, may not be avoidable, depending on the date of cancellation. If a student cancels because he/she or a member of his/her immediate family (parents or siblings) has a medical condition which prohibits the student from participating on the trip, all efforts will be made to give a full refund upon receipt of written letter from a medical doctor. Airline penalties, however, may not be avoidable, depending on the date of cancellation. Any fundraising money applied to the tour cost prior to cancellation will be returned to the school unless otherwise specified by the teacher.

TRIP PRICE

Tour price is based on the cost of accommodations, admissions and the value of the dollar as of March 13, 2006 and is subject to change reflecting dollar's value. We reserve the right to assess surcharges such as airline imposed fuel surcharges whenever they are announced.

AIR TRANSPORTATION

All air transportation is via a regularly scheduled air carrier. Airfare is based on special group ticket prices and current departure taxes and is subject to modification.

EXTENSIONS & DEVIATIONS

are available on a very limited basis and are subject to a \$100 processing fee plus any additional airfare costs. Deviations, once confirmed, are non-refundable. If the requested deviation is not possible within the group's airfare contract, a participant may choose to secure his/her own airfare. A land-only price is available upon request from CETA Tours. Land-only participants are responsible for securing and the payment of all transfers required to join and/or leave the group's itinerary. **All deviations must be requested must be requested on the application.**

INSURANCE

Should a student be required to leave the trip for disciplinary reasons, all expenses for facilitating the early return are the responsibility of the parent/guardian of that student. In addition, the student forfeits the right to any refund on the land portion of the trip.

- We reserve the right to substitute points on the itinerary where conditions demand or warrant such substitution.

ITINERARY

Friday, June 15 • Depart

We depart on our overnight flight to Paris, France. In flight services will include meals, beverage service, and a movie. **(IF)D**

Saturday, June 16 – Tuesday, June 19 • Paris

Upon our arrival, we meet our coach and driver and transfer to our hotel. During our time in the “City of Light” we will visit famous sites like the Eiffel Tower, the Louvre, Notre Dame and much more. We also take an excursion to Versailles where we have a self-guided tour of the Château and also enjoy the gardens and fountains that are turned on only on Sundays. Our other sightseeing activities will be determined by our teachers shortly before departure. **(IF)B/L/D**

Wednesday, June 20 • Tours

We leave Paris today and drive first to Chartres to see the beautiful cathedral there. We then continue on into the Loire Valley and Tours. The Loire Valley is known as the “playground of the kings,” because many of them built magnificent summer homes to take respite from court life in Paris. We visit one of these chateaux today, Chambord. It has more than 440 rooms and is built on an estate encompassing 13,000 acres. We take time to walk the grounds before continuing on to Tours. Once in Tours, we meet our host families with whom we spend the next five days. **B/L/D**

Thursday, June 21 – Monday, June 25 • Tours

Our family stay in Tours is the most important part of our tour. Here we have the opportunity to be part of the culture and way of life of the French people. During this time we will be participating in family activities, getting together with young French people, and doing activities in the area as a group. One day we will enjoy an excursion to visit more of the famous chateaux. We also take a train excursion to Amboise. **B/L/D**

Tuesday, June 26 • St. Malo

It is time to bid our new friends “adieu” and travel north to visit Mont St. Michel. Located off the coast of France, for centuries, the only land access to this monastery was at low tide. Now a causeway connects the island to the mainland. After our visit we continue on to St. Malo where we check into our hotel and have the rest of the day at leisure. **B/L/D**

Wednesday, June 27 • Bayeux and D-Day Beaches

Today we travel to Normandy and learn about the 1944 D-Day invasion. We visit the beaches where the invasion occurred, including Utah Beach and Omaha Beach. We also go to the town of Arromanches where we see remains of the artificial port that was instrumental in the Allied victory by keeping Allied Forces supplied. We also see the Pointe du Hoc, a series of cliffs that were scaled using hooks to get at pillboxes. Finally, we continue on to Bayeux for our overnight. **B/L/D**

Thursday, June 28 • Paris

This morning we have time to explore Bayeux and visit the Tapestry museum here. The highlight at the museum is a 231-foot long embroidery created in the 11th Century. It depicts the conquest of England by William the Conqueror. We then travel to Caen, another port city involved in the Allied invasion. Finally, we continue on to Paris stopping en route in Rouen. We arrive in Paris in the evening in time to have some dinner and pack for our return. **B/L/D**

Friday, June 29 • Return

Sadly it is time to say “au revoir” to la Belle France and transfer to Paris’s Charles De Gaulle Airport to board our return flight. We return with many memories of beautiful landscapes, lovely cities, magnificent chateaux, and a wealth of new friends! **B/(IF)L**
