The Red Pyramid— Rick Riordan

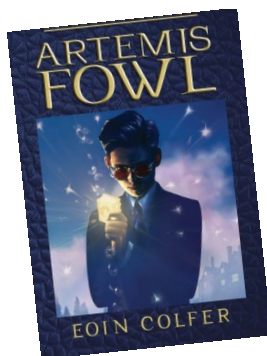

Artemus Fowl— Eoin Colfer

Twelve-year-old Artemus Fowl is a millionaire, a genius—and, above all, a criminal mastermind. But even Artemus doesn't know what he's taken on when he kidnaps a fairy, Captain Holly Short of the LEPrecon Unit. These aren't the fairies of bedtime stories; these fairies are armed and dangerous. Artemus thinks he has them right where he wants them...but then they stop playing by the rules.

Jeremy Thatcher— Bruce Coville

Small for his age but artistically talented, twelve-year-old Jeremy Thatcher unknowingly buys a dragon's egg.

The Sea of Trolls— Nancy Farmer

After Jack becomes apprenticed to a Druid bard, he and his sister are captured by Viking Berserkers and taken to the home of King Ivar the Boneless and his half-troll queen, leading Jack to undertake a vital quest to Jotunheim, home of the trolls.

The ruins of Gorlan— John Flanagan

When fifteen-year-old Will is rejected by battleschool, he becomes the reluctant apprentice to the mysterious Ranger Halt, and winds up protecting the kingdom from danger.
