1. Celebrations: Chili Cook Off was successful, Field Day was successful, TELPAS, 5th gd students are showing great progress in preparation for Reading TAKS, PTO participation for Valentines Day parties, the staff has had a great start up for Project Share.
2. Campus Information:
 - a. Staffing: Still waiting for budget to be finalized
 - b. Calendar: Suggestions for changes to the calendar were discussed month by month.
 - i. Reducing the amount of Saturday camps. Questions were brought up such as, do we get the biggest bang for our buck having as many Saturday Camps as we do? We anticipate that District Reading Camps will no longer be provided by the district, which is okay because we have reading camp through Super Camps. Students enjoy the camps and having some camps would definitely be worthwhile. The question then is, how many camps should we have based on next years budget?
 - ii. Cut back Family Computer Night to the first Thursday of every month. That seems to have the best turn out of the month.
 - iii. How often do we need to send out the newsletter? Cutting back to a bi-monthly or monthly newsletter would save money on paper.
 - iv. Meet the Teacher could be on a campus day when teachers are already on campus rather than having to rush back to school after a district professional development day. The Friday before school starts was suggested. Also, the time this year was 7-8pm. Feedback was given that it would be nice to have it a little earlier but still late enough that our parents would attend, such as 4-6. The PreK representative also noted that having 2 hours to stagger parents would also help them.
 - v. 4th gd teachers felt rushed having the first Writing Camp in September, they would like to move it to October.
 - vi. We could try Fall Literacy Night as a Lunch Bunch. The Math day was very successful during the day. Keep the Jan/ Feb Literacy Night as an evening event, incorporate Book Fair if possible.
 - vii. Add a Staff Holiday Party in December.
 - viii. Keep Field Day the Friday before spring break. The weather was great and teachers felt it was a good way to send the kids off to spring break.
 - ix. Move the Cheer Parade so that it's not on the same day as LAT testing so NAC can participate.
3. Parent Involvement: We should have \$5,000 to use toward playground equipment.
4. Staff Development: Ask your teams if there is any interest in rescheduling the KOI, Gizmos, and TAKScopes trainings that had to be canceled earlier in the year. Email Don if teachers are interested.
