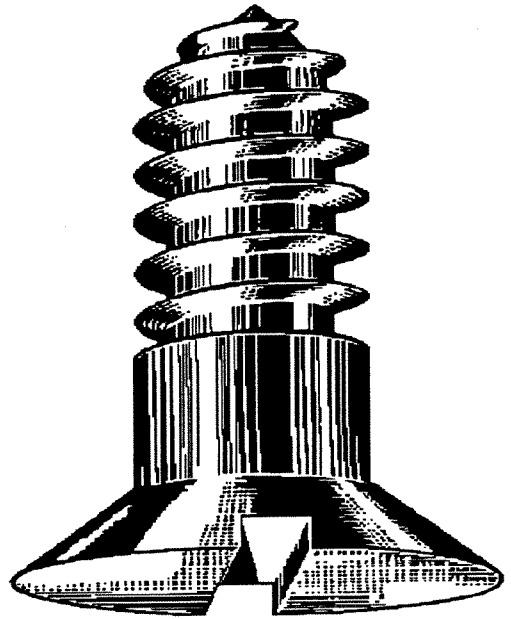

(at the end of words)

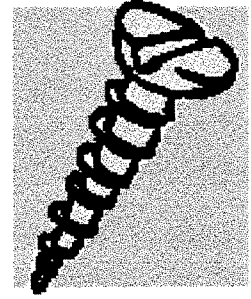


dew flew blew grew stew crew new

“a few coins” “a new straw hat” “dew on the leaf”

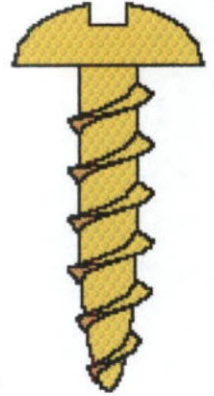
“hewed down the tree” “meat stew” “crew of the ship”
