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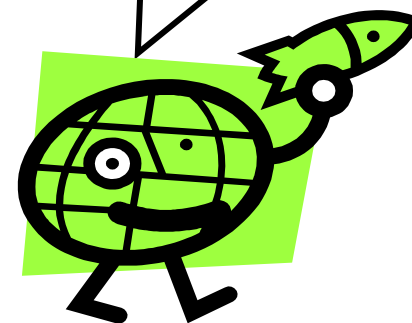
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Cyberbullying & Netiquette

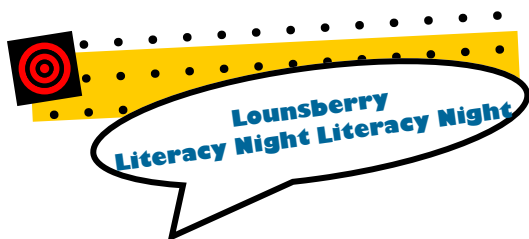

☐ Creative Writing

☐ Learn Spanish through Music

☐ Podcast Stories

Podcasting—audio story in MP3 format. Create your own one minute story inserting sound effects. Learn how to record it live using Podcasting technology !

☐ Alliteration

Alliteration is an expressive form of figurative language and jump-starts the writing process. Join some of Lounsberry Hollow's students as they take you through a fun-filled approach to using alliteration.

☐ Animoto

Students will guide you in easily creating visual stories incorporating images, video, music, and text to share and express learning. Animoto is also a great way to share your own family's "stories."
