

Adding Narration and Other Audio Files with Photo Story 3

First you must have a microphone plugged into your computer and either speakers or headphones connected to use this feature of Photo Story.

- 1) With your prepared script or by using the window on the narration screen to help you with your script get ready to speak.
- 2) Configure your microphone once it is attached to your computer by clicking on the “configure microphone” button and follow the prompts.



- 3) Begin recording by clicking on the red “record” button. Make sure the picture you want the narration on is highlighted.



- 4) Stop recording by clicking the “stop” button.



- 5) If you need to you can delete the narration but clicking on the “delete” button.

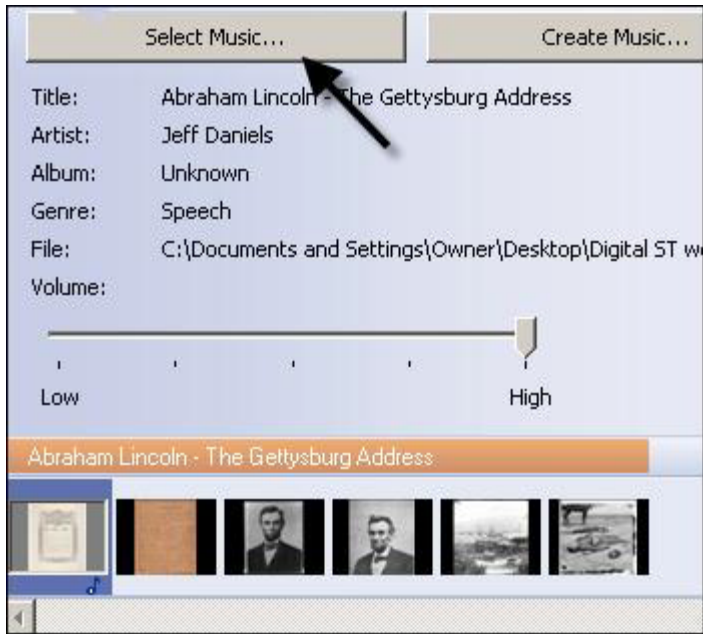


- 6) Click “next” to go to the next section. If at any time you need to go back and edit anything on the story press “back” and it will take you to the previous section.

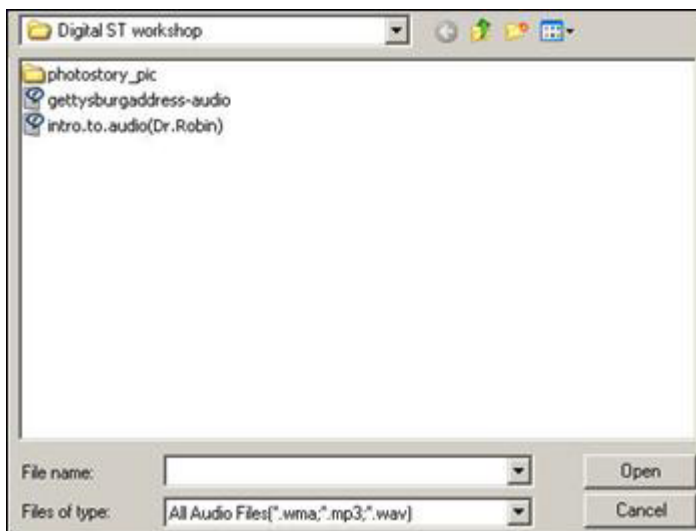
Adding the Gettysburg Address Audio to your Photo Story

- 1) When you come to the section you have the choice to either press “select music” or “create music.”

In this case, we want to add our own audio file, so we will press the button that says Select Music. Note, that the audio file you want to add may not be a music file -- it may be a speech or other type of audio, or like in our Gettysburg Address file, an audio clip that contains both spoken words and music together. But Photo Story chose to call all external audio files "Music" so this is the button we will use. (Perhaps in the next version of the software, they should rename that button Select Audio.)



- 2) A window like the one below will appear and you will browse to the location where the audio file you want to include is located. When you find it, highlight the audio file and press the **Open** button. This will insert the audio file into your Photo Story. Make sure at the file type box at the bottom of the window that “**all audio files**” is selected before you hit open.



You can hit the “**preview**” button to preview your story with the included audio to hear how it sounds.
