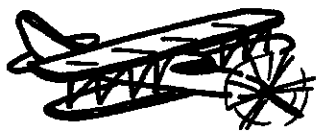


THE GREAT WAR

And the world hoped there would never be another one like it. Use the map on the next page and these activities to review some crucial information about World War I.

1. Look at the map on page 31 and use your history book or encyclopedia to find the countries that were part of the **Allied Powers** during the war. Write their names below. There are sixteen. Shade these countries green on the map. Two Allies are not shown on this map because they are not in the European area. Be sure to include them on the list.
2. Write the names of the countries in the **Axis (Central) Powers** (below). There are four. Shade these countries yellow on the map.
3. Also write the names of the countries in Europe that were neutral. Shade them purple.

4. Locate and label in red the spot where Germany sank the British passenger ship, *Lusitania*, off the southern coast of Ireland. This ship was carrying many Americans, and this was the event that finally drew the United States into the war.
5. List below three or more **causes** of the war and three or more **effects** of the war.

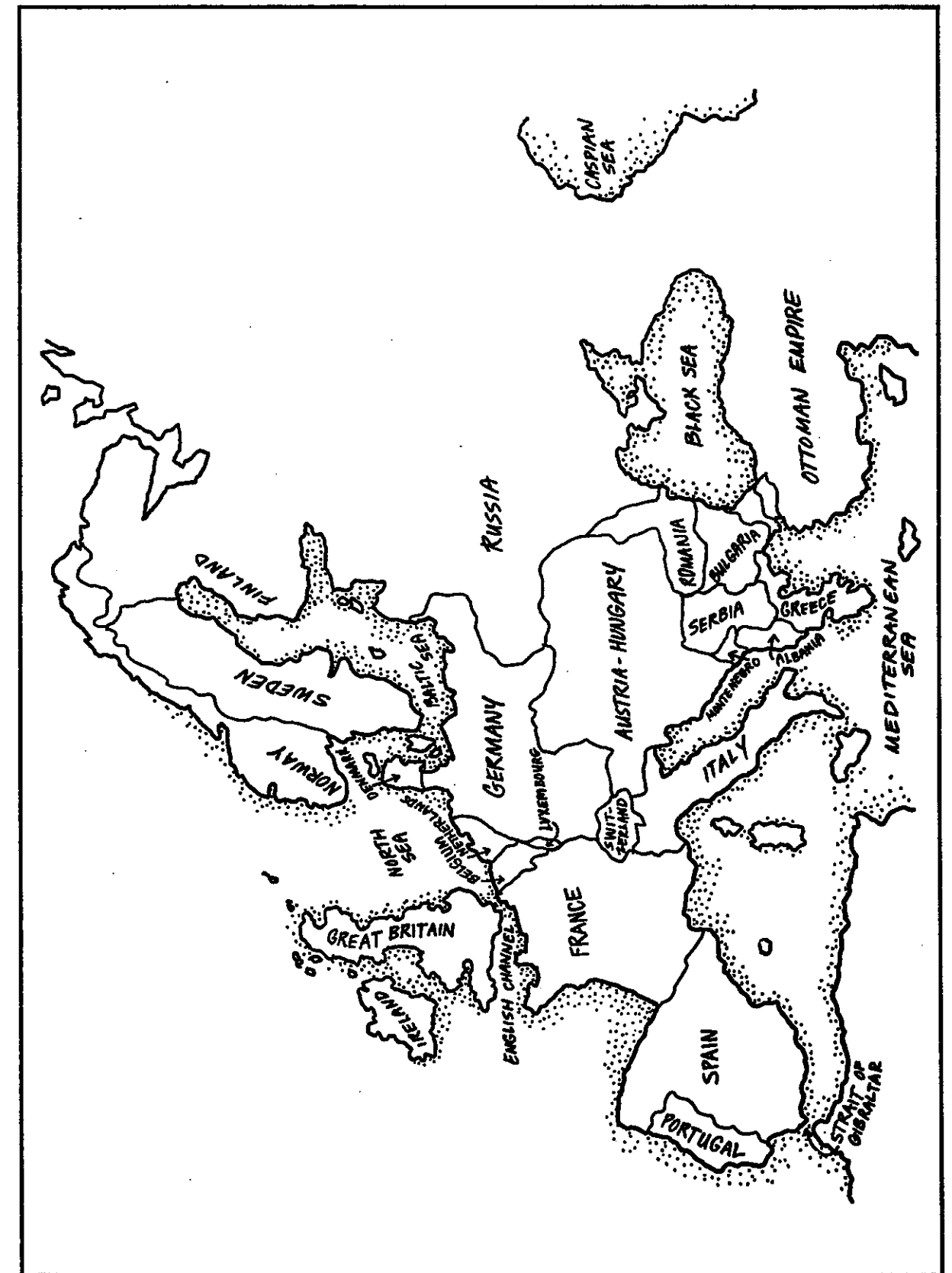
