- 1.6 'We would be ashamed of our finest acts if the world were aware of the motives behind them.' [Rochefoucault] [50]

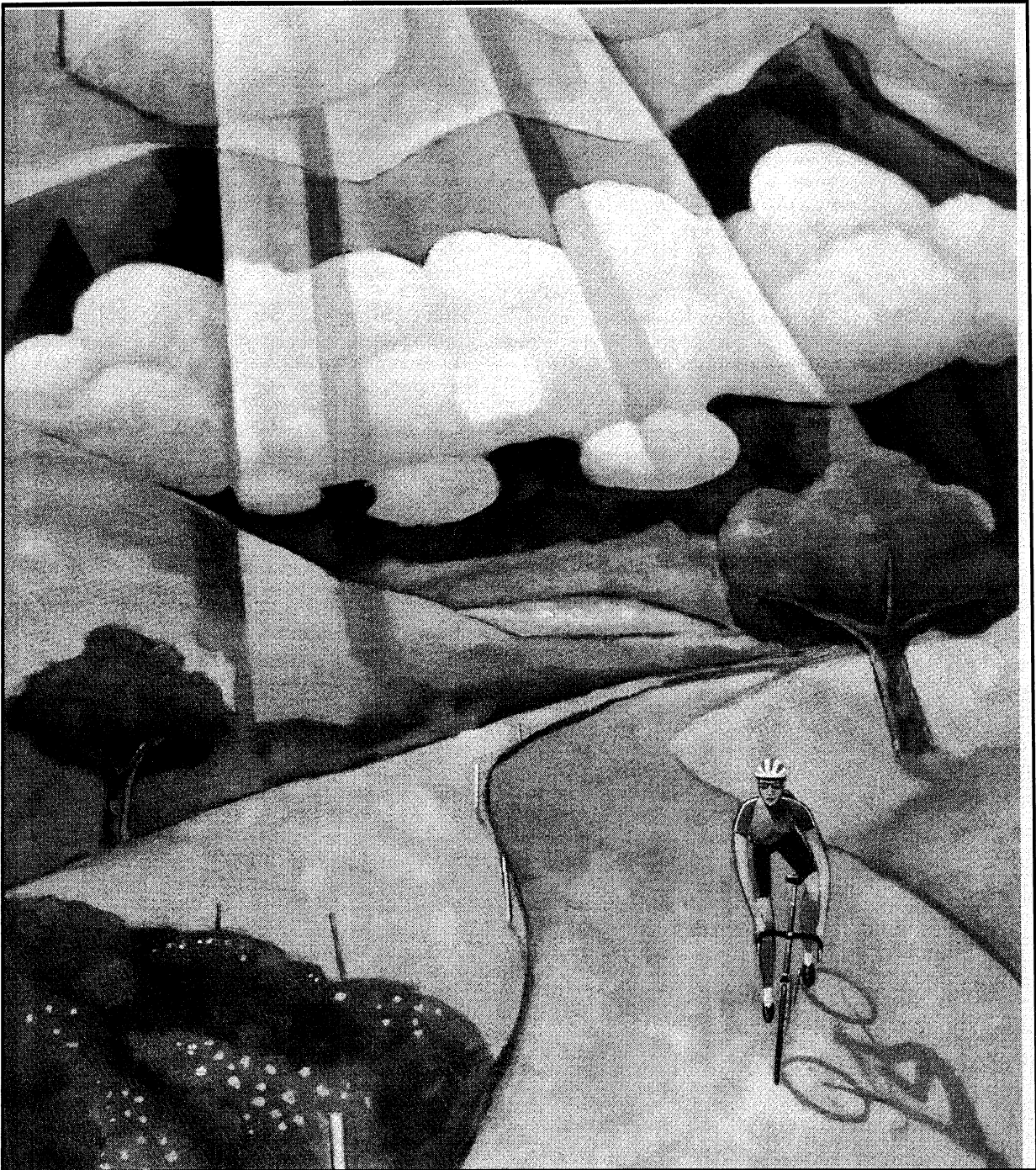

Your younger brother/sister is having difficulty coping with the sporting activities, chores at home and homework that take place in the afternoon.

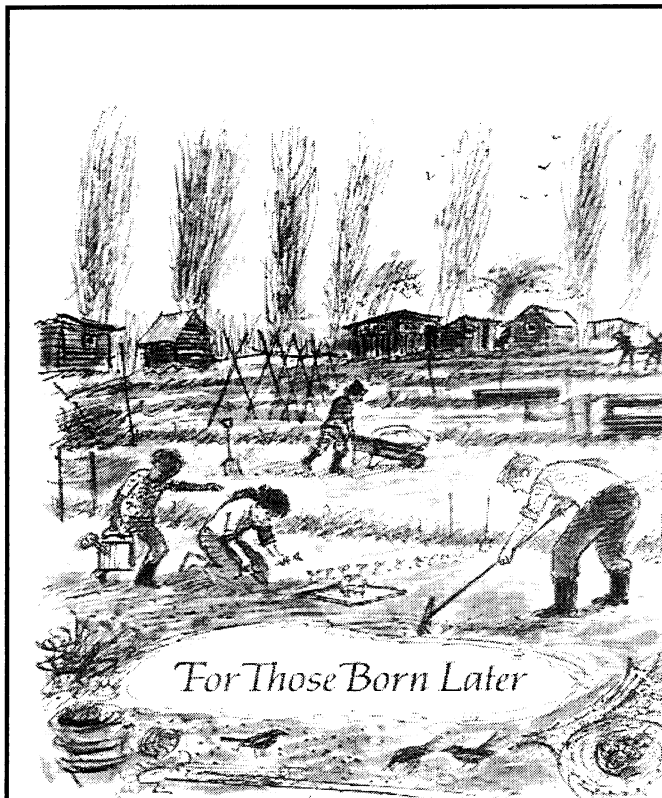
Draw up a list of instructions in which you set out how to cope with the various necessities to be completed in an afternoon.
